POCKETS worth picking

Studies show that briefcases increase the risk of bringing work home. That's why we leave ours under the bed. But you still need a way to transport a cell phone and stolen office supplies.

London Fog's commuter coat is equipped with several inside pockets for a cell phone, a newspaper, train tickets, and more, leaving nothing exposed to the elements—even you. Constructed of water-resistant microfiber, it sports a concealed hood and is long enough to fit comfortably over a suit jacket. Despite all those pockets, the jacket doesn't look or feel bulky.

Timberland's cotton-and-nylon twill backpack jacket can be worn over a sport coat or with your hiking clothes. The lightweight waterproof jacket and hood protect you from rain and wind, plus there are four large patch pockets in front that can handle a stapler, a tape dispenser, a microcassette recorder, and the boss's autographed photo of Bucky Dent. And the detachable backpack is large enough to hold a few files, a jumbo bag of chips, or one of those miniature dogs. —K.C.
