For an authentic theater experience this winter, be on the lookout for an HDTV. While there are three main categories of big-screen TVs — flat panel, rear projection and front projection — flat panels, whether they use LCD or plasma technology, are typically the most popular.

The main selling point for HDTVs: $\hbox{higher-quality resolution} --\hbox{in fact, HDTV}$ offers more than twice the resolution of standard programming.

And here's another shopping tip: Bring along a couple of your own DVDs (preferably those with dark scenes) to select a new set that's just right.

Movie, Sports, Performance, Game and Dynamic — Pioneer's 50-inch (\$4,000) and 60-inch (\$5,500) KURO HDTVs offer a listening experience comparable to a movie theater. KURO's Optimum Mode, a feature that monitors video and room lighting, adjusts the picture and sound automatically no need to fiddle with the remote.

LG's PG60 series includes 50-inch (\$2,500) and 60-inch (\$3,800) models, which deliver deeper blacks and superior shadow detail, and also features high-tech perks like Dual XD Engine, THX Display Certification, four HDMI inputs and built-in AV modes to customize picture and sound settings based on what you're watching.

Even if you have an extensive DVD collection, a Blu-ray player can make for a good. investment. First of all, most Blu-ray players are backward compatible and actually improve the resolution of DVDs — so your collection will look better than ever.

Secondly, a Blu-ray player is the single best way to get a crisp image onto your new HDTV. Additionally, the surplus of storage capac-

picture interactivity and delivers possibly the most cutting-edge video processing on the market. The player also offers iitter-free playback of CDs, a center loading tray for

reduced vibration and highperformance DVD playback, all backed by a one-year warranty. As the winner of PC World's

Best Buy award, the BDP7200 from Philips (\$399) boasts features such as Deep Color (utilizing more than 1 billion colors and eliminating on-screen color banding to create vivid images), BD-Java compatibility, picture-in-picture and EasyLink

LG's BD300 (\$350) is the first Blu-ray player to wrap up Blu-ray and Netflix into one shiny package, allowing Netflix subscribers to instantly stream more than 12,000 movies and television shows via a high-speed Internet connection.

For a more budget-conscious holiday season, check out HD-compatible DVD players, such as Pioneer's DV-410VK DVD player (\$99), which when used in conjunction with an HDTV can upgrade your DVD collection to a higher resolution at a fraction of the cost.

The Roku Netflix Player (\$99) is compatible with every type of television from the latest HDTVs to a standard set and is a must-have for Netflix junkies. The player provides Netflix customers unlimited access to a library of more than 12,000 movies and television shows, and they can stream titles straight to their televisions at no additional cost. It's simple to set up and requires only a broadband connection (wired or wireless)

A SEASON OF SOUND

A quality sound system can make vour entertainment system come to life. While speakers can be purchased piecemeal, for optimal sound quality, choose a setup that includes five to seven speakers, including main speakers (front left and right), rear speakers (surround sound), a subwoofer and center speakers.

With unique champagne-glass styling and audio expert Mark Levinson's tuning, LG's LHT888 Home Theater System (\$650) packs a punch at an affordable price. Comprised of a 700-watt 5.1-channel DVD receiver, floor-standing front and rear (wireless) speakers, a tabletop center speaker and a subwoofer, the LHT888 offers superior image quality and audio performance.
