# Explore the Everglades on Your Next Marco Island Vacation

From the coastal mangrove swamps to the sawgrass prairies and wooded hammock islands, the Everglades is just bursting with all kinds of birds, gators, turtles, and even critters like the Florida panther and manatee. Bring some binoculars and your camera!

## **Exciting Everglades Tours**

Now, the best way to explore the Everglades is through a guided tour. Unless you've got a swamp buggy or airboat, those marshy waters and mucky trails can be tough to navigate. Take it from me. Luckily, there are some fantastic

tour operators that will show you all the sites and wildlife while keeping you high and dry.

Captain Jack's Airboat Tours over in Everglades City is one of my favorites. Their high-speed airboat rides zip you through the tight mangrove tunnels and out over the open marshes. And those boat captains have eagle eyes - they'll spot alligators and birds you'd never see on your own! After your ride, you can check out Captain Jack's animal sanctuary, filled with rescued critters. It's a blast.

If you prefer a quieter ride, I recommend booking a kayak tour through one of the Everglades City outfitters. Paddling the rivers and inlets with a guide lets you get super close to jumping fish, lounging gators, and wading birds. Bring some snacks and a bottle of water, and enjoy the serenity.

#### **Dress for Adventure**

Make sure to wear good walking or hiking shoes in the Everglades, since many of the trails and boardwalks can be muddy and uneven. And don't forget your mosquito spray - the bugs can be fierce!

I recommend lightweight, breathable clothes that dry quickly. A hat and sunglasses are a great idea too. It gets hot out there under the Florida sun. And you'll want sunscreen and water to stay hydrated. Pack layers in case you get cool from the breeze while zipping around on an airboat.

# Top Sights and Trails

There's so much to explore in the Everglades that it can be tough to choose. Here are a few of my favorite spots:

The Anhinga Trail in Everglades National Park is a must-do. It winds through sawgrass marshes and past a crystal-clear alligator-filled lagoon. Bring your camera - you'll see gators sunning themselves on the shore looking like prehistoric monsters!

Stop by the Oasis Visitor Center in Big Cypress National Preserve and walk their boardwalk loop. It's a beautiful introduction to the cypress swamp ecosystem. You'll see ferns, orchids, and maybe some cute turtle hatchlings. And for a real treat, book a paddle or boat excursion out to one of the Ten Thousand Islands. These secluded islets have some of the most beautiful

sandy beaches and clear shallow waters you've ever seen. Great for shelling, swimming, or just beach-combing in solitude. Pick an island like Horse Key or Indian Key for a magical experience.

# Where to Stay Nearby

The town of Everglades City has a few charming little inns and B&Bs that put you close to the action. I've stayed at the very House and can recommend it. Their breakfasts are delicious!

For more choices, I suggest booking one of the comfy vacation rentals over on Marco Island, just 40 minutes from the Everglades. Nothing beats relaxing on the patio of a beachfront condo after a long day of exploring. Marco also has some pet-friendly rentals so you can bring Fido!
