What is advanced primary care?

The need for APC in the current healthcare environment

Simply put, it's what healthcare should be. Advanced primary care is a healthcare model for building stronger relationships, increasing engagement, lowering costs, and improving outcomes. It takes what people have come to expect from standard fee for service healthcare — the long waits, the frustratingly short appointments, the shuffle of specialist visits, the high costs and stress — and turns it upside down, creating a new model with aligned incentives that benefit patients, providers, communities, employers, and insurers while saving money.

In the current system — which relies on transactional, incident-based interactions between patients and physicians — most people see a doctor only when they're feeling sick, and only when the situation seems dire enough to warrant the cost of a visit.

What is **advanced primary care?**

According to a recent CNBC article, <u>over half of</u>

Americans put off medical treatment because of cost concerns. Even those with health insurance may delay getting help until they feel so poorly that they bypass their primary care clinic altogether and go straight to the emergency room.

In this type of system, costs can quickly spiral out of control. For patients paying out of pocket, underutilizing primary care in favor of urgent care can mean the difference between <u>a simple \$150</u> <u>visit vs. a trip costing thousands of dollars</u> to treat an issue that might easily have been diagnosed and addressed beforehand.

Not to mention that patients rarely receive satisfactory appointments when they do make them — ones composed of long waits and impersonal treatment, infrequent visits to their primary physician and various specialists, and anxiety about the price tag attached.



Advanced primary care provides a more proactive and comprehensive approach, minimizing obstacles to health by emphasizing time-rich appointments, empathetic listening, and behavior change. The results are better outcomes, improved population health and satisfaction, and fewer claims.

What is **advanced primary care?**

Delivering advanced primary care starts with understanding what's important to people's health and working backwards to build a model around it.

- Accessibility to more providers, smart scheduling, low to no-cost visits, convenient locations, and no wait times
- Primary care providers who have the time,
 support and staff to provide most of a person's
 care care that in today's system is being
 outsourced to specialists
- Empathetic listening that goes beyond prescriptive medicine, building connections and understanding of a person's whole health
- **Time-rich appointments** that allow people to be heard and providers to understand them beyond their symptoms
- An informatics platform that identifies health risk opportunities and provides actionable insight into utilization

- Care coordination to prevent gaps in communication and treatment when specialty care is appropriate, including follow-up, and integration into the member's care plan
- Professional health coaches who use the transtheoretical behavior change model to help patients improve their lifestyles and achieve life goals
- **Culture change** is the result of people seeing their care team as an extension of their friends and family, and the powerful realization that they, themselves, are in control of their own health



SECTION TWO

APC: A better healthcare model

Under the current system, primary care physicians in traditional clinics are hard-pressed to meet their patients' needs for greater time, access, and services.

Because of this, they've had to sacrifice several key touchstones — namely, time-rich appointments, strong relationships, and consistent involvement in the patient's health journey — as a matter of necessity. This fee-for-service model demands, among other things, seeing as many patients as possible, which seriously diminishes the time and attention they can spend with patients, getting to know them beyond the symptoms they show up with.

APC: A better healthcare model

Advanced primary care, in contrast, flips the current standard of healthcare upside down, starting with what's most important to patient health: time and understanding.

The model is built to allow providers the time they need to form trust with their patients, so they can work on understanding not just their physical health needs, but the social, financial, and social determinants that underlie who they are. Within the advanced primary care model, the care team has everything they need to serve their patients and communities the way they were trained to. It also delivers aligned incentives, like optimized utilization and quality of care over quantity of patients, that drive down costs through better health.

Making primary care the first and often only stop for healthcare needs, questions, and concerns gives members a greater sense of security that helps ease them away from an encounter-based approach toward richer value-driven interactions that deliver the right care to the right person at the right time.

APC offers many advantages over both the traditional care model and the prevalent "urgent care as healthcare" mindset.





Care providers





Core Services for Most Healthcare Needs

Health coaching


