- A key stock benchmark notches another record.

**The S&P 500 closed** at a record high for the 30th time this year, as Big Tech <u>rallied</u> and traders geared up for a reading on retail sales.

- Even as Wall Street bulls raise their targets, <u>hedge funds</u> are turning cautious on the Fed's reluctance to cut rates.
- **Philadelphia Fed** President Patrick Harker <u>reiterated</u> that a single reduction is appropriate for this year.
- And Cleveland Fed chief Loretta Mester, on the eve of her retirement, <u>urged</u> the central bank to better explain how it would respond to different economic outcomes.

**Donald Trump's pledge** to roll out a 10% across-the-board tariff on imports would essentially amount to a <u>tax increase</u> of \$1,500 to \$1,700 for American households, economists warn. Joe Biden's reelection campaign is kicking off a \$50 million <u>advertising blitz</u> ahead of next week's presidential debate.


### By the Way
