

An Israeli strike on Beirut sent traders <u>rushing to</u> bonds and gold, with stocks mostly falling, along with oil. The tech-heavy Nasdaq 100 slid 1.4%, as a gauge of the "Magnificent Seven" megacaps sank 2%

- **Microsoft** sank about 6% after it <u>reported</u> a small earnings miss on cloud revenue.
- **AMD** rose after posting an <u>upbeat sales</u> forecast, a good sign for AI.
- **Starbucks** reported <u>a drop</u> in revenue as coffee treats lost traction.

What Else Is Happening

Kamala Harris is expanding <u>swing-state efforts</u>—a new poll shows the race in <u>a dead heat</u> in seven battlegrounds. "White Dudes for Harris," featuring Pete Buttigieg and Mark Ruffalo, <u>raised over \$4 million</u> for the VP's campaign yesterday. Meanwhile, Ken Griffin is spending tens of millions <u>to back</u> Republican primary candidates, but not Donald Trump so far.

In other news:

- **Project 2025 director** Paul Dans is <u>stepping down</u> after Democrats repeatedly attacked the plan and Trump distanced himself from it.
- **Microsoft** is investigating <u>outages</u> of some Office applications and cloud services, which <u>disabled mobile ordering</u> at Starbucks.
- **Tesla** released a software update to 1.85 million US cars to prevent vehicle hoods from opening while driving.
- **Rent for Toronto condos** fell this year for the <u>first time since</u> 2021 as a surge in listings brought some relief to renters.

Pay up. CenterPoint wants customers to <u>cover nearly \$2 billion</u> in costs stemming from a windstorm and hurricane that blacked out much of the Houston metro area. The utility intends to sell bonds to deal with up to \$1.8 billion in storm costs that would raise power bills by 2%.


