**The Supreme Court ruled** Donald Trump has <u>some immunity</u> from criminal charges for trying to reverse the 2020 election, all but ensuring the ex-president's obstruction trial <u>won't happen</u> before November.

- **The ruling punts** the case to a lower court and <u>tasks it with</u> deciding how Trump was acting—as a private citizen or in his official duties—when committing alleged crimes.
- **It's a partial victory** for the former president, but also for the current one, mostly as a <u>distraction</u> from chatter on his debate performance.
- **Such talk is what** the DNC is seeking to <u>hush</u> as it considers formally nominating Biden as early as mid-July.

# What Else Is Happening

**The Boston Celtics'** owners will sell a <u>majority interest</u> in the franchise this year or early next, the team announced just weeks after it won its 18th title. The move comes at a time of surging valuations for sports franchises, with the Celtics coming in at \$5.1 billion, according to Sportico.
