

NMCRS San Diego Long-Time Relief Services Assistant Retires After 44 Years With Society

Richard Nixon resigns from office as President of the United States. Sears Tower (now Willis Tower) in Chicago is completed. Satirical Western comedy film "Blazing Saddles" is released. The year 1974 had some life-changing events, especially for Eleanor Sanchez. It's the year she started working for the Navy-Marine Corps Relief Society.

Eleanor's story started before that. Eleanor grew up in the Imperial Valley, after being brought to the United States when she was six-years-old. In 1973, she came to San Diego to go to business school. She graduated as a legal secretary from Kelsey Jenney Business College in Miramar. NMCRS contacted the college when it had an opening for a secretary. Eleanor was sent for an interview and was hired as a clerk typist on October 21, 1974. It's a day she will never forget, because it's also her mom's birthday.

"I took the job thinking that it would be temporary since I wanted to work in the legal field," Eleanor said.



Lucky for us, Eleanor became a permanent staff member. She went from clerk typist, to staff assistant, to office assistant, and lastly, relief services assistant. Since she held many important positions within the Society, Eleanor was someone many people went to when they had questions. She was always willing to drop whatever she was doing to help, and she did it with a smile on her face. This often meant that there was no "typical" work day for her.

"Many times I would come in thinking that I was going to get to everything on my to-do list, then I'd be called to trouble shoot issues with the printer, take an emergency leave or a regular case due to a caseworker being absent, cover for the client coordinator or something else," Eleanor said.

It didn't matter if her day sometimes didn't go how she had originally planned it. Eleanor loved helping Sailors, Marines and their families, and enjoyed working with all the volunteers. She knew she was making a difference when she was able to help a widow in need.

"I used my Spanish and negotiating skills to assist a widow in bringing her deceased husband's remains back to the United States from Mexico."

Eleanor used her skills for 44 years to help Sailors, Marines, and their families. She retired at the end of 2018. Now that she's retired, she is getting some much needed home repairs completed, and is planning to take a trip to the Holy Land in the fall.

Although she's already given great advice to many volunteers and staff members, she wants to

make sure employees remember to nurture and empower the volunteers, and remind everyone to "work as a team."

When asked if she would have done anything differently during her time with NMCRS, Eleanor simply said, "No."

"It has been an honor and privilege to work alongside so many awesome volunteers and employees while helping those that put their lives on the line to defend this great country of ours," Eleanor said.
