Why consider fertility preservation?

People choose to preserve their fertility for many different reasons, including:

- Age: A person is born with all the eggs they will ever have, and
 the quality and quantity of those eggs tend to decline over the
 course of their life. Sperm is produced throughout a person's
 life, but the health and vitality of sperm do decrease as people
 get older. Fertility preservation at a younger age may increase
 the chances of a healthy pregnancy in the future.
- Medical conditions: Radiation, chemotherapy, hormone
 therapy, and some surgeries can have a negative impact on
 fertility. It's often possible to freeze eggs, sperm, reproductive
 tissue, or embryos before these treatments to protect a
 person's ability to have children.
- Health conditions: Conditions like sickle cell anemia, lupus, and rheumatoid arthritis can increase a person's risk of infertility, so fertility preservation may be recommended in some cases.
- High-risk careers: Exposure to radiation and toxic substances like pesticides, lead, metals, and petrochemicals may be harmful to fertility. It's also often recommended to freeze eggs, sperm, or embryos before starting a job with significant physical risk, like careers in the military and logging.
