1.1	How to Find Projects with PlanHub 2.0 (maybe written on a chalkboard?)
PlanHub 2.0 provides the only tool you need to discover new projects posted directly by general contractors, Project Finder.	

Here, you can quickly find projects that fit your business, thanks to our easy-to-use filters. Simply click on "filters", and you can adjust your search by "trades", "distance by miles or regions", "bid due date", "construction type", and more options You can even save and access filters you previously created to save time on future searches.	
To search for projects using keywords, simply enter them into the search bar above. PlanHub will not only display the projects that include your keywords, but also show you how many times they appear in that project's documentation, listing each document for you.	
Project details are easy to access. Click on the project listing you're interested in learning about to bring up a project overview on the right. There, you'll see helpful information like a brief project description, matching trades, project values, proposed schedules and more.	
1.2	How to Learn More About Projects with PlanHub 2.0 (maybe written on a chalkboard?)
PlanHub 2.0 includes all the files and information you need to learn more about projects and create winning bids. We make it easy for you to not only find the exact files you need, but review them, mark them up, and share them with your team.	

Click the "View project files" button under your projects listing to access a complete list of all available files for that job. If you're looking for a keyword, type it in the search field and click the magnifying glass to pull up a list of the documents that contain it. Or, "search by matching trade" to narrow down to only documents that are relevant to your listed trades.	
Checkmark any documents from the list you'd like to download, and click on the appropriate button at the bottom of the screen. If you'd like to explore the file right on your screen, simply click on it, and you can see it, mark it up and even add signatures digitally with File Viewer. Select keywords will be highlighted in the doc, and you can easily add notes, images and comments that you can share with your team.	
Within a project listing, click on the "general contractors" tab at the top of the screen to see which GC's are bidding on the project. Click the "general contractors" tab to see all of the general contractors bidding on the job.

at-a-glance Bid Board, making it easy for you to manage	
your bids all the way to the finish line	
2.1	Manage Your Bids in PlanHub 2.0 with Bid Board (maybe written on a chalkboard?)
Whether you're discovering bidding opportunities using	
Project Finder or selecting them from ITBs sent to your	
inbox, you can easily add any project to your Bid Board from	
any screen - just click on the star.	
Click on "bid board", where you can instantly see the updated status of all of your active bids. To zero in on the project you want to review or update, use the search or filters above the bid board to search by Team Member, Lead Source or Bid Due Date.	
Assigning a bid to anyone on your team couldn't be easier. Just click the symbol under the project's value, select the team member you want, and click assign. They'll be instantly notified and can get to work.	

Recently-added projects will appear under the "Saved Leads" heading. From there, it can be moved to different stages of the bidding process - estimating, bidding, won or loss. To change its status, you can either click on the 3 dots on top to use the drop-down menu or manually click and drag it to the column you want.	
You can even add projects that originated outside of PlanHub. Just click "import project," enter the project information, add necessary documents and general contract information, and hit create. Just like that, your added project will appear on your bid board, ready for you to manage.	
2.2 Takeoff and Estimation	How to Perform Takeoffs and Estimations with PlanHub 2.0 (maybe written on a chalkboard?)
Takeoff by PlanHub is the ultimate time-saving tool for accurately measuring and calculating project needs and costs. Fully integrated with PlanHub 2.0, starting a takeoff is a breeze - simply click "Prepare Takeoff" right from any project on your bid board.	
In takeoff, you'll see a list of projects you've saved or imported. Click on the one you want so you can access the attached project documents. You can find a particular one using the keyword search function. When you are ready to start a takeoff, just click on one of the project documents.	
Your project will open to a table of contents where you can view your plans at a glance.	
After selecting a plan page, you can start measuring your areas and linear distances. The toolbar at the bottom of the screen contains all of your primary takeoff tools like area, volume, and slope.	

First, set your scale by clicking on the scale button on the	
tool bar and adjusting the scale to match the plan.	
For quick measurements, use the ruler tool: left-click to	
start, drag your mouse, and release.	
To create a measurement, select your tool. For example,	
with the area tool, use 'two-point' for simple shapes or	
'multipoint' for complex ones. Name your measurement,	
set any properties, and left-click to outline the area.	
Double-click to complete it and view the totals on the right.	
To save recurring measurements or share them with your	
team for future use, right-click on any measurement and	
choose "Save to Library." To access your saved	
measurements, navigate to the "Library" tab in the right-	
hand panel.	
To create an assembly, click 'Assemblies,' then 'Create	
Assembly.' Add a name, select the type, include cost items,	
and click 'F-x' to set a formula.	
From your takeoff, you can right-click on any of your	
measurements to send them to your assembly and estimate	
of choice. Verify displayed area totals and click "insert	
values," then click on the green pop-up banner to go to your	
estimate. Click the button for an expanded view, and you'll	
see everything there. You can add additional cost items right	
from this screen, or click "cost items library" to access or	
add preset items.	
Click 'Download' or 'Export' to share your estimate or	
takeoff and submit your bid.	
To seamlessly share your estimate with PlanHub's 'bid	
builder' tool, simply click 'send to bid builder' and create	
your proposal.	

2.3	How to Submit Bids with PlanHub 2.0 (maybe written on a chalkboard?)
Once the measuring and calculating for a project is done, it's time to create your bid. With PlanHub 2.0, you can either submit a "quick bid" or create one using one of our easy-to- use templates.	
You can get a bid started from various places in PlanHub 2.0, including your Bid Board. Click on the project you want, and click "submit bid" alongside the project name to access both options.	
To submit a quick bid, simply select your trade, enter your base bid amount, and include up to three accompanying documents. You can also type in a message to accompany your bid. From there, select the general contractors you'd like to share with, decide on the bottom whether you'd like your bid automatically shared with additional GC's if they get added to the project, hit submit, and your bid is on its way.	
If you prefer to build your bid from scratch, click "Create a cost breakdown" to reveal your "Bid Builder. Type keywords in the "select trade" box to find and select the trades you need, input items and costs, and create line items for your bid. You can edit, duplicate or delete each line item using the symbols to the right. Enter the appropriate tax amount at the bottom to automatically add that cost to your estimate. If you want to save this template to use in future bids, click "save to template". When you are ready to proceed, click "next"	

Select the general contractors you'd like to share your bid with, selecting whether you'd like your bid automatically shared with additional GC's if they get added to the project. Add any additional documents to your bid, hit submit, and your bid will be on its way. Finally, take a look at a preview of what the GC's you selected will see when they receive your submission. If you'd like to change anything, hit the "back" button and make your revisions. If not, hit submit. It's that easy!
