"At a minimum, an updated master bathroom should include two sinks, nice lighting and a walk-in shower. To avoid looking dated, it's a good idea to pick neutral paint colors and finishings as well."

If you own an older home with one and a half baths, adding a new bathroom can significantly add to the value of your home as well. Tacking on an additional bathroom will add 8.7 percent to the value of your home according to a National Association of Realtors study.<sup>2</sup> "A buyer looking for a three or four bedroom home will want two full baths," adds Norman. "If your home only has one and a half, I would recommend adding a bath rather than renovating the one full bath you already have."

Norman stresses that, when considering a contractor to remodel a bathroom, it is important to hire a professional licensed contractor. A licensed contractor:

- **Will help you determine the best way to spend your money.** They can take a look at your budget and suggest the best strategy and materials to complete the job.
- **Is legally obligated to guarantee their work.** That means they are motivated to do the job right the first time around!
- Can get better prices on materials like tile, paint and grout and pass the savings on to you.

• Finally, unlicensed contractors are notorious for shoddy work.<sup>3</sup> You may have to hire a licensed contractor to make repairs adding to the cost of the project.<sup>3</sup> Thus, you might end up spending well beyond the original quote you received from the unlicensed contractor.
