## SEATTLE

Light rail and a star chef are leveling up Ravenna, a quiet, boho neighborhood.

**Why Now:** This lovely, leafy district of craftsman bungalows was already on the rise thanks to new bike lanes and a light rail station slated to open nearby in 2021. But then chef Edouardo Jordan really put it on the map.

**Where to Go:** First settled by the Duwamish, Ravenna stretches from University Village—a

tony outdoor mall—to roughly NE 85th Street. Its anchors: indie Third Place Books and the connected Cowen and Ravenna parks, where trails wind along a creek ravine fringed by hemlock and red cedars. The neighborhood's proximity to the University of Washington campus always has made the area open-minded—so much

so that it's nicknamed the "Metaphysical Belt." Get in groove with holistic health workshops at the East West Bookshop and stock up on goods at Zenith Supplies, The Herbalist and Tummy Temple. Then take a spin through M & L Records & Models for rare LPs or let the kids blow off steam at Roaring Mouse Creative Arts Studio.

Finish at one of Jordan's restaurants, which are turning mellow 65th Street into an international dining destination. At the 2018 James Beard awards, he landed best chef northwest for Salare and best new restaurant for his Southern star, JuneBaby, which explores the cuisine of the African American diaspora. But he's not the area's only standout talent: Leave time for Arriba Cantina (Pacific Coast Mexican), Chiang's Gourmet (Sichuan, weekend dim sum), The Shambles gastropub, Sod House Bakery and Wataru (Edomae-style sushi). — **AMANDA CASTLEMAN**
