












"More, perhaps, than teachers, afterschool program staff are poised to provide caring relationships, teach perseverance, and challenge students."

A lot goes into structuring an after-school program that leads to student success: effective pedagogy, engaging activities, student participation, and so much more. Another element — perhaps the most important — is positive connections with students.

Healthy relationships with adults are key to student success. In after-school programs, the ability to trust and connect with program leaders is foundational to student engagement in activities and the development of life skills such as perseverance and meeting challenges.
