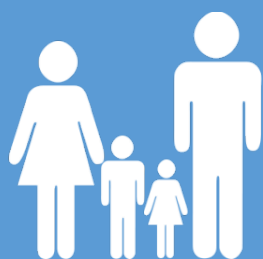

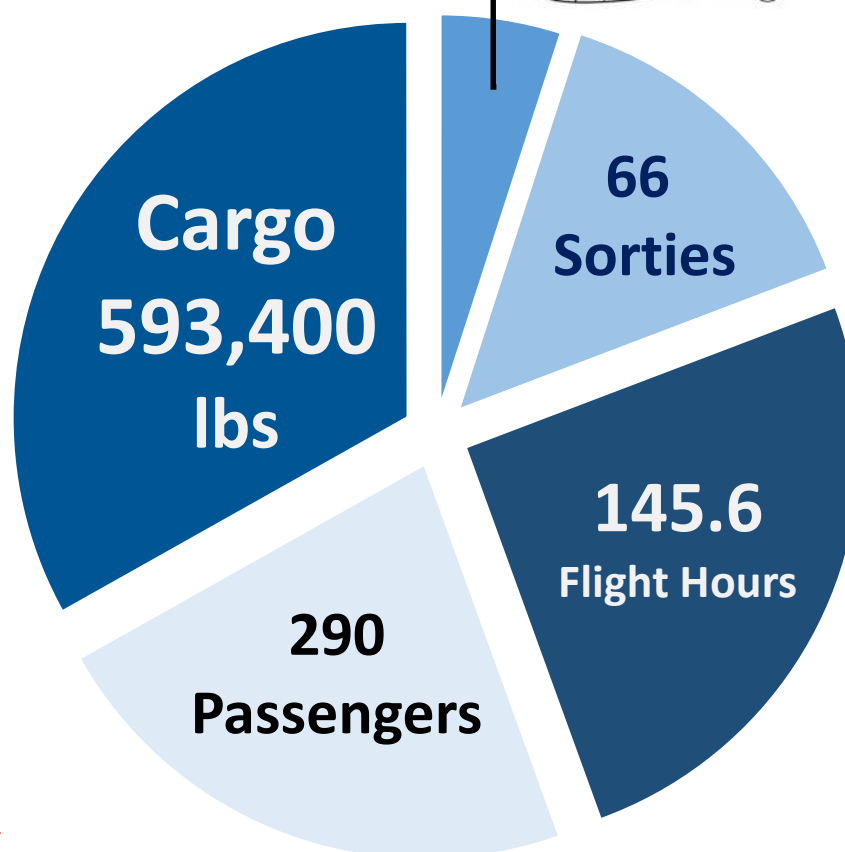
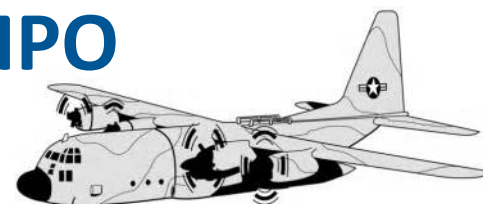

EVENTS & ACCOMPLISHMENTS

The Puerto Rico Air National Guard is committed to helping their community recover and return to their normal way of life. We will continue to fly missions, provide security and support wherever we can. We will be strong in the fight and partnership with FEMA and our other military brothers and sisters to move this great territory back to sustainability.

- The Puerto Rico Air National Guard should be commended for their dedication and loyalty to service. Even with their own personal situations and difficulties, the Airmen of the 156th have continued the ANG mission.
- ANG Teams restored FAA flight operations within seven days after storms to achieve 100% airspace visibility taking the air operations from six aircraft per hour to normal operations of 45 per hour.
- Despite significant damage to Muñiz ANGB, the base is 95% operational after recovery efforts.
- Executed missions for 100% accountability of Muñiz Airmen and two Geographically Separated Units.
- Hosted President of the United States including escorting more than 150 media increasing public visibility.
- Hosted Vice President of the United States Visit including escorting more than 50 media.
- Hosted visits from multiple Congressional Delegations, Chief of the National Guard and other VIPS to include Cabinet Members and Director of Army National Guard and Speaker of the House
- The PRANG conducted 11 Community Engagement missions: distributed 16,426 gallons of water, 9,325 meals, 5,370 lbs of rice, 4,035 cans of beans, 2,700 cans tuna, and 900 lbs of oatmeal impacting 7,076 community members.
- 141st Air Control Squadron has filtered and distributed over 85,000 gallons of water to seven municipalities on the west side of the island.
- ANG teams were responsible for the receipt of all military aircraft since the storm. They coordinated millions of tonnage arriving at the airport to include the unloading and initial distribution of FEMA supplies, donations and other critical cargo. The teams also established a Space Available passenger terminal and have received most of the incoming military assets assigned to Puerto Rico for recovery and relief. Muñiz has resumed all airfield and PAX operations.
- The PRANG has flown 20 missions using their C-130 aircraft to support FEMA, the Army National Guard, the Virgin Islands and to receive equipment and donations from the mainland.
- ANG teams received and delivered 18 pallets of mail in a significant effort to assist the US Postal Service.
- ANG teams assisted sister federal agencies in the delivery and loading of critical cell towers to restore communications to the island.

While the base is approximately 95 percent operational, the storm has left buildings condemned, communications equipment destroyed, extensive water damage to facilities and furniture, caused massive displacement of offices and equipment, and hindered aircraft maintenance performance.
