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Subject: Proposal to encode the Nsibidi script in Unicode

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1. Introduction

This is a proposal to encode the Nsibidi writing script in Universal Character Set. Nsibidi is a proto-writing system primarily used in Southeastern Nigeria for the Igbo language. This proposal provides a background for the writing script, implementation details, and a character repertoire.

There are no past Nsibidi proposals that this proposal can build upon.

2. Background

2.1 Overview

Nsibidi, often referred to as Nsibiri, is a pictographic and ideographic writing script originating from the southeastern region of the Niger-Congo area within West Africa. Today, this region is modern-day Nigeria. The languages that informed the creation of Nsibidi are Ekoid, Efik, Ibibio, and Igbo (ISO 639-3: ibo), which are all Igboid languages that are collectively spoken by more than 50 million people around the world.

Nsibidi is comprised of two sets of characters. Nsibidi has a phonetic set called Akagu and a radical/combination set referred to as Nsibidi similar to Japanese with Hiragana as a phonetic set and Kanji as a radical/combination set.

2.2 Precolonial Use

The origins of Nsibidi can be traced back to as early as 2500 BCE, well before British colonization of Nigeria. There's evidence to prove that languages beyond Igbo have history using Nsibidi as a form of communication within society.

2.3 Modernization

Widespread standardized use of Nsibidi hasn't been established within the past two decades mainly due to western colonization and the Nigerian government's deprioritization of general native language education. This has led to Nsibidi being discussed and used primarily from a research perspective rather than a practical academic, embedded cultural, or even artistic perspective.

Despite the lack of standardization of the script, many individuals and community groups have contributed to improving and modernizing Nsibidi in efforts to best represent the current dynamic and diverse nature of Niger-Congo originating or related languages. These languages include: Ejagham, Igbo, Efik, Ibibio directly through the Ekpe society and Louisiana and Haitian Creole as well with Nsibidi use in New World Afro-religious practices such as the Abakua manuscripts, a secret society in Cuba or its influence on Haitian Veve and African American Hoodoo (Wahlman, 1986)

Many West African and Diasporan languages are of a homonymic nature and would benefit from the system as well as its spiritual and social implications for the preservation of culture through writing which would benefit the long-term education for all those that use the script. (Wahlman, 1986)

One notable contributor is Chiadikobi Nwaubani, who is a digital illustrator and Nsibidi script expert. He has redesigned more than 2,000 Nsibidi symbols within the Nsibidi character set (Nwaubani). His work will be referenced regularly throughout this proposal.

3. Script

The proposed Unicode script will be assigned the name "Nsibidi". The proposed repertoire contains 66 alphabet letters, 5 diacritics, 80 radicals, and 2526 graphemes.

We are proposing to create a new Unicode block similar to CJK that will enable future character additions to be made to the script.

3.1 Structure

Nsibidi is written from left-to-right. It includes two characters sets: a phonetic and a radical/combination set. The phonetic set is called Akagu which includes vowels and consonants written as full letters. Igbo is a tonal language. Therefore, Nsibidi, includes five diacritic marks to apply to vowels, diagraphs (a combination of two letters representing one sound, such as 'gb' of 'kp'), and nasal sounds.
