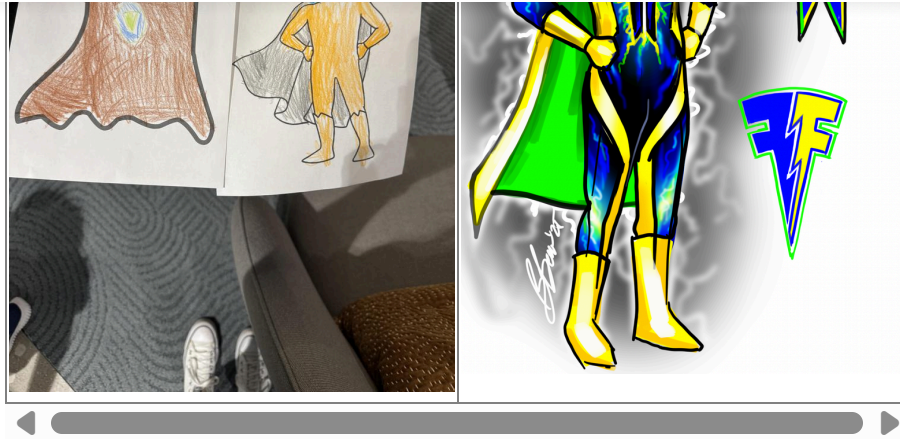
Every superhero has an origin story – and Finn's began when he was diagnosed with cancer. After learning he had a brain tumor, Finn faced months of treatment. His courage, laughter, and an imagination never slowed down. So, when it came time for his wish, he didn't just dream of being a superhero — he became one!

When Finn told the Make-A-Wish Foundation that he wanted to be a superhero for a day, the team at Stanbury Uniforms, a division of Varsity Spirit, was ready to help. Together, they transformed his drawings, dreams, and endless imagination into something extraordinary—a day filled with missions, laughter, and heart.



## From Wish to Wonder

Led by Stephen Flowers and the Stanbury team — including Chelsea Niemeier, Kristen Scott, and artist Brent Becker — the group took Finn’s superhero drawings and brought them to life. Brent transformed Finn’s sketches into bold, comic-inspired artwork, while Chelsea coordinated the perfect suit sizing (with a little help from her son as a model).



The result: **Finn the Flash**, a new kind of hero powered by courage, kindness, and joy. The team didn't just design a costume, they built an entire superhero world where Finn could see himself as the hero he already was.

*"It was never just about a costume," said Stephen Flowers. "It was about creating a world where Finn could be the star of his own story."*

## Becoming Finn the Flash

On October 18, 2025, Finn's superhero adventure began. The day kicked off with breakfast and a mission briefing for "Energy Crystal Rescue" at Sky Zone Trampoline Park. His task: recover twelve missing energy crystals stolen by the Trickster, using trampoline jumps to power up his abilities and his **Heartforce Shield** to protect the crystals.

After a victory lunch at Portillo's, Finn continued to Fritz's Adventure for "Operation Sky Saver." This time, the Weather Wizard had captured a friendly explorer, and it was up to Finn — now fully suited in electric blue, yellow, and green — to navigate obstacles and save the day once more.




## A Hero Every Day


Finn’s powers as Finn the Flash included super speed, a shield made of courage, and a laugh that could brighten any room. But his family knows his greatest power is his heart. Every week, he faces challenges that would test even the bravest adults, yet he continues to inspire everyone around him with strength, humor, and hope.
