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KEYSTONE RESORT KICKS OFF DAILY SUMMER MOUNTAIN OPERATIONS

Keystone Resort kicks off daily summer mountain operations on Friday, June 9 at 10 a.m. Keystone Resort's summer season provides a laid-back environment that is full of adventures with fewer crowds, allowing guests to enjoy authentic mountain experiences at a pace they dictate. With a dedicated trail crew, the Bike Park will feature a variety of new upgrades and additions, including new features, re-worked trails, increased bike haul capacity and a free skills park to promote progression. The Keystone Bike Academy caters to riders of all levels with beginner clinics, private lessons, downhill guides and a new camp designed just for kids.

Stand up paddle boarding, kayaking, canoeing, paddle boating, lakeside bicycle rides, whichever the mode of transportation the Keystone Lake presents a picturesque mountain setting. Located in Lakeside Village, the Keystone Adventure Center provides boat and bike rentals, arcade games, beach toys, snacks and a bar.

TOUR DE LADIES WOMEN-ONLY CYCLING EVENT RETURNS TO DOUGLAS COUNTY

The Tour de Ladies women-only cycling event is excited to return to Douglas County on July 8. The Tour de Ladies empowers women through pedal power by encouraging women to be physically active, train for the event, and participate at the level they feel comfortable. It also empowers women through the financial contribution of the event's proceeds to a local nonprofit that primarily serves women – the Crisis Center.

This year the event will begin and end at Parker's Fieldhouse – a premier athletic event venue in Douglas County. The route, which will be fully supported with "SAG in drag" (men in skirts to help change **CONTINUED** >

flat tires and provide other on-course assistance) and aid stations, features options of 13 miles (new), 30 miles and a 62.5 mile metric century for cyclists of all levels.

"Tour de Ladies welcomes women who are new to cycling and those who ride regularly," said Jon Tarkington, director of this year's Tour de Ladies event. "We added a shorter course this year to encourage more women to participate, especially those who are doing their first organized bicycling event. The three courses offer manageable challenges that past participants have given rave reviews for scenery, signage and on-course support. We're excited to support the Crisis Center for the fifth year, with proceeds and additional donations going to help their work toward a world free of violence."

Last year's Tour de Ladies event had 465 registered riders and raised more than \$15,000 for the Crisis Center, which provides programs and services to domestic violence victims. Organizers expect to surpass the participation rate and fundraising this year.

"It really takes organizations like Tour de Ladies to assist us and be a part of the fight against domestic violence to help us achieve our mission," said Jennifer Walker, Executive Director of the Crisis Center. "We need this kind of support to build a strong, safe and healthy community."







When executing a vision, I look for ways to be collaborative and help others. Success is a non-zero sum game. I believe that I can win while helping others win at the same time."



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


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MARINO'S PIZZERIA

MARINO'S FOOD IS THE REAL DEAL, AND SO IS MARINO.

Arino's Pizzeria in Littleton is exactly what locals hunt for: that nestled-in-the-neighborhood, mom-and-pop place that relies upon word-of-mouth to attract a following to its authentic Italian cuisine.

The "mom and pop" of Marino's are he and his wife, Angela. Marino is the maestro cook and Angela delights in managing the operations of the restaurant. "I would not be here if it was not for her," Marino says of his wife. "It's my dream, she supports me."

His passion for pizza started when he was just five. He watched in wonder while his grandparents had their own wood-burning oven built, and Marino's dreams were ignited. "I loved it so much," he says with a wide grin beneath his characteristic mustache. "I was watching my next-door neighbor build the ovens. I thought, 'what can I get out of that thing?" So he learned to construct his own ovens. "I build my ovens to fit around the pizza, not my pizza around my oven," he says with the discrimination of a craftsman.

He "stole the simplicity of good food" from his grandmother, he says. "There's no ranch dressing, no Alfredo in Marino's food," he laughs. "Probably the most important thing about my pizza is the flour—imported from Italy."

> Marino serves me a red wine called Terredora Aglianico to sip while I wait. He tells me it is made in a vineyard where he stomped grapes from the time he was a boy. CONTINUED >

"I WOULD NOT BE HERE IF IT WAS NOT FOR HER," MARINO SAYS OF HIS WIFE. "IT'S MY DREAM, SHE SUPPORTS ME."

"You cannot get that wine for that price anywhere else," he says, noting his connections to the winery.

The first delight to emerge from Marino's oven is an appetizer, brussels sprouts immersed in bacon pieces. Flaky and, oh, so satisfying.

He then delivers the Gnocchi (nyō-kee) with meatballs. The potato pasta is served with marinara sauce, zesty and light.

Marino's favorite pizza on the menu is the Bella, a beauty made of spinach, roasted garlic, sausage and olive oil. Simple and simply amazing.

The finale is the Four Point Calzone, a gorgeous mixture of supple crust, Italian sausage and prosciutto, ricotta, mozzarella and shaved parmiggiano cheeses. If I had to choose a favorite, without question, this is it.

But no mattar what you choose on the menu, the authenticity and warmth of Marino's will draw you in as a devotee to this fresh Italian cuisine.

Marino's opens at 5 p.m. every day (except on Mondays—they're closed). It's best to call a day in advance for Friday or Saturday seating (303) 955-0373. You can also reserve a table online at **MarinosPizzeria.us**.



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


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
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- THE MOTHER OF REINVENTION

The Indian Motorcycles brand has had more lives than a cat. Originally produced from 1901 to 1953 in Springfield, Massachusetts, Indian became the largest motorcycle manufacturer in the world in the 1910s and perpetually morphed its brand and focus throughout the 20th century. From its World War 2 focus on designing military models exclusively for the U.S and its Allies to its resuscitation and near-death numerous times, Indian Motorcycles ceased production altogether from 1977 to 1998, declared bankruptcy in 2003, rose up again in 2008 and enjoyed a fortuitous acquisition in 2011 by snowmobile and ATV manufacturer Polaris Industries.

Since that serendipitous merging, Polaris has been enjoying a steady whoopin' of, ahem, competing motorcycle brands, thanks in large part to the Indian Motorcycles brand, and specifically to bikes like the limited-edition Chieftain Elite. Only the second touring bike Polaris has introduced, the Chieftain Elite was released in April 2017 at a price point of \$31,499.

Only 350 of the bikes will be built, and the enduring legacy and romance of the Indian Motorcycle brand still draws riders like a moth to the flame -- a particularly fitting metaphor for the Chieftain Elite. Hand-painted in custom Fireglow Red Candy with Marble Accents in Indian's custom paint facility in Spearfish, South Dakota, no two motorcycles are ever the same.

The Elite's high-end touches include include primary and cam covers with color matched pinstripes, a color-matched headlight bezel and flared tinted power windscreen. The tight rake of 25 inches and shorter wheelbase enables great cruising and handling when opening up the 1,811 cc Thunder Stroke, and the Elite gets consistently high marks for both rider comfort and superb cruise control operation.

Keyless ignition, remote locking sidebags, and a touchscreen Ride Command info/audio/navigation system come standard, as well as Elite's unique feature: a 200-watt premium audio system. One rider discovered the ability to connect his personal device via Bluetooth to more than one bike at a time, for true rocking-and-rolling with Chieftain-riding friends.

And with releases like the top-of-the-line Chieftain Elite, the Indian Motorcycle brand is sure to keep rockin'-n-rollin' its way into America's heart.

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
