Intro for podcast:

1. Every time we seem to get the upper hand on COVID there is a new twist, variant or guidance change. How are you, the great folks at LCMC Health and your family doing this continual stress?

2. RUSS: Tell us a little about LCMC Health.

(TANYA answers)

3. RUSS: After two long years as Chair Elect, you've just begun your time as CHIME Chair! What are you excited about and looking forward to the most?

TANYA:

- First, there's ViVE A brand-new, groundbreaking digital health event coming up in early March in Miami. CHIME is in partnership with HLTH, which as most of our listeners know is a fantastic organization with a great industry conference record. We're bringing our best resources together to offer a conference for everybody in digital health, with education and networking opportunities that are unprecedented. We have heard so much excitement in the industry in response, and our speakers and sponsors are pouring in.
- Another major development is CHIME University's new graduate degree programs – this is incredibly exciting:
 we are now launching a licensed graduate program

offering both Master of Digital Health and Doctor of Digital Health. We're building on three decades of great professional education to take it to the next level.

- This university will offer instruction from both expert industry professionals and academic resources.
- It is completely self-paced and completely online,
 so learners can progress at their own speed.
- And it is very affordable, because we are committed to making this experience available to as many people as possible who want to develop their digital health careers.
- And another terrific aspect of 2022 is our 30th
 Anniversary this is a big milestone year for us!
 - We're going to have a major celebration in San Antonio at the CHIME22 Fall Forum – so that is going to make our Fall Forum one to remember. It's just going to be amazing to celebrate all these years of the ways we have served our members and the industry, and most importantly, the great relationships that CHIME has fostered for so many digital health leaders over the years. It's a big, welcoming extended family, and this is going to be an incredible reunion for old friends and new ones.
- 4. The industry truly flexed, adapted and thrived despite the pain of COVID. What do you believe the biggest learnings and changes are from the last 24 months?

TANYA:

- Add some thoughts of your choice about industry challenges and changes
- Agility had been key. We've learned that we can change and transform a lot faster than many people thought we could: for example, the way virtual healthcare sprang up practically overnight when it became a must after the pandemic struck. I think it showed everyone that digital health is the future, and now, transformation is coming very fast.
- One challenge is that remote work has led us to a talent war not only in the USA but internationally as well. One one side, it's great to be able to hire from anywhere in the world. But smaller organizations or groups in rural areas with lower pay scales due to the cost of living are having to compete for workers with major cities like New York and San Francisco where employers can offer double the salary to health professionals. So that is a new staffing issue that leaders are facing in addition to the overall need for more IT talent in our pipeline.
- 5. How has CHIME and its Board also flexed to respond during this time?

TANYA:

- Discuss any examples of your choice from the CHIME Board.
- But as we respond in 2022, we're always focused on our CHIME 3.0 strategy to be a complete digital health association for our members and the entire industry. It began as a vision a couple of years ago. Now CHIME 3.0 has flourished and become a reality as we see all these major new programs that CHIME is launching to build leadership in our industry and bring people together for innovation, collaboration, and top-flight education.
- 6. As you think about guiding CHIME along our 3.0 strategy journey, what do you see as the greatest opportunities for our industry?

TANYA:

- We are now at a moment when digital innovation is truly Revolutionizing Healthcare –
- We are seeing advanced technologies, solutions and processes that change the way healthcare is delivered and consumed.
- Complete transformation is coming from AI and machine learning, advanced analytics, patient portals that offer total engagement for patients 24/7.
- CHIME has a special role to play because we offer a
 unique space for collaboration, and collaboration will
 play a key role. To fully implement these advanced
 technologies, the industry will have to come together to
 share data and work in whole new way. And we are here

to help create those collaborative opportunities and advocate for good federal policy to support this digital revolution.

7. Looking to VIVE and the CHIME Spring Forum in March, are there any unique opportunities you're looking forward to taking advantage of?

TANYA

- This new and completely unique event is designed and lead by Senior Digital Health Leaders for Digital Health Leaders.
- ViVE is not your average health industry conference: it is a highly interactive experience focused on digital transformation: this is all about innovation and making those connections for the creative, collaborative work it's going to take to get where we are headed.
- The CHIME22 Spring Forum is at ViVE: it's a full 3-day conference with special members-only education and all the exclusive networking opportunities that our CHIME Forums always offer.
- BUT, there is going to be so much more! We're going to have scores of C-suite speakers offering the latest insights from the field.
