THE ADMINISTRATION OF JUSTICE CURRICULUM

The core curriculum at Salve Regina is designed to deepen your knowledge in the liberal arts and sciences and refine your skills of inquiry, analysis and communication. All students engage in coursework that cultivates relationships between the past, present and future. Discussion focuses on enduring questions and contemporary challenges as students explore, connect and apply knowledge through a capstone course. The focused administration of justice curriculum incorporates an understanding of the main branches of the justice system: law enforcement, the courts and corrections. In addition, our curriculum incorporates Salve Regina University's Mercy Mission in that we emphasize that the justice system must constantly work towards "a world that is harmonious, just and merciful" to all. Our ethics centered curriculum challenges our students to be ever mindful of our duty as practitioners in the justice system.

In addition, all students are invited to join the Navigator Leadership Development Program. This four-year co-curricular option is designed to help students develop as leaders through social responsibility at the individual, group and societal level. Concurrently, faculty-nominated students are welcome to apply to the Nuala Pell Leadership Program in Public Service at the end of their sophomore or junior year. Student fellows accepted into the program have the opportunity to learn from accomplished leaders from many industries.

HANDS-ON LEARNING

The administration of justice field lends itself well to experiential service learning. Undergraduate majors have the unique opportunity to explore the discipline through a 3-credit internship experience. Past internships have been completed in local, state and federal law enforcement agencies, various courts and law firms as well as corrections and probation, all of which deal with addressing the problems our justice system is facing today. Graduate internships are also available on a limited basis in cybersecurity and digital forensics.

STUDY ABROAD

Salve Regina University is proud to offer over 200 study abroad programs in 45 countries. On average, more than 30% of students at Salve Regina participate in either a full semester, year-long or short-term study abroad program while earning their undergraduate degree. As part of the study abroad curriculum, students can take courses that help them fulfill their undergraduate core curriculum courses, improve their language skills, or courses which complement their Administration of Justice required courses or electives. In recent years, Administration of Justice students have participated in study abroad programs in England, Italy, Japan, Morocco, Australia, Ireland as examples. Students can also fulfill general study requirements in a variety of short programs offered annually.
