There are several, but for this article we will consider Grammarly and Hemingway; their distinct features, benefits and limitations and most importantly, which choice is better for freelance writers.


What Is Grammarly?

<u>Grammarly</u> is one of the most popular text-editing tools. As the name implies, it is keen on your grammar. Moreso, it checks your spelling, punctuation, sentence structure, passive voice, and plagiarism. It has free, premium and business plans as your budget fits. The premium plan starts at \$12.00 per month and the business plan is \$15.00 per member monthly. The premium and business plans have the same features, while the free version is a bit restricted (in terms of plagiarism check, passive voice, and tone selection).

Features

Grammarly has several features for you to ensure your editing is precise and the experience, pleasant. Here are some.

1. Colour representations and score:



Grammarly makes use of different colours for editing. If a word is underlined in red, it is incorrect (grammar, spelling or punctuation). A green underline means that the phrase causes the work to be less engaging, while a blue underline means that the word or phrase is unclear and needs to be rewritten. Apart from the colours, it gives you a score out of 100 that increases upon improved editing.

2. Language preference:



You can choose one from British, American, Canadian and Australian English.


3. In-built dictionary:

It enables you to add commonly used words, perhaps native names, to your dictionary.

4. Plagiarism checker:

The paid versions provide a plagiarism checker that scans about 16 billion different websites to avoid intentional and unintentional plagiarism.

5. Goal-setting:



You can set goals for your audience, intent, style, formality and domain.

6. Importing and exporting files:

- Deals with only English language


What Is Hemingway?

<u>Hemingway</u> is a program that improves the conciseness and comprehension of your writing. It targets passive voice, adverbs and hard-to-read sentences. The Hemingway editor can be used online and through the desktop app. The latter requires a one-time payment of \$19.99.

Features

Some defining characteristics of the Hemingway editor are listed below.

1. Colour representations and grades:



Like Grammarly, Hemingway uses colour representations for editing. Only that it highlights, not underline. Blue highlight stands for adverb usage, green represents the presence of passive voice, and purple represents phrases that can be broken down. More colours are yellow and red, meaning hard-to-read and very hard-to-read sentences.

Additionally, this program shows grades for different levels of readability. For instance, grade 7 is easier to read than grade 14.

2. Text editor tool:

The text editor located at the top of the page enables you to add headings, paragraphs, hyperlinks, and numbered lists, amongst other things, to your text.

3. Separate write and edit sections:

The separate write and edit section is an essential feature. Some writers might get frustrated with correcting phrases before making a complete sentence. In other words, the "write" section allows you to keep pouring down ideas without breaking the flow. You can find this at the top right of the page.

4. Importing and Exporting files:

Like Grammarly, the Hemingway app allows you to import and export files before and after editing.

Pros

- Works offline
- More affordable
- No account needed for usage
- Allows direct publishing to medium and wordpress

Cons

- Does not check for writing tone and spelling.
- Cannot check for plagiarism

Which Should I Pick as a Freelance Writer?

As a freelance writer, choosing what tool to use could be a hassle as each writer has their peculiar conditions. For example, a creative writer/storyteller would prefer a program that allows tone selection and does not cut down on the use of adverbs.

The Hemingway app would favour someone with a slim budget. It is also suitable for someone with a good grasp of English grammar and strong spelling skills because it focuses on

readability and adverbs instead. On the other hand, Grammarly's premium edition contains many features that will make you a more proficient writer.

In conclusion, your best bet would be to use both applications when writing anything technical; because of the advantages and drawbacks of each.
