Era

The history of the world is typically divided into two Eras:
The Age of Separation & The Second Era.

The term era has been used archaically to refer to a period of time which describes anywhere between 800-1500 years.

To the common folk of the world, these two times are all that are known. In many cases, those who are uneducated may not be informed about the Age of Separation.

Despite this popular belief though, there are actually four other eras which predate the Age of Separation.

Year

For the Second Era, each year is uniquely expressed by the era and its ordinal numeration with respect to their first year of the era.

Unlike the Second Era, the Age of Separation progressed starting from the zeroth year. Additionally, the other eras (now referred to in this document as 'the lost eras') were dated backwards. Starting from approximately 800-1500.

Month

Each year is composed of twelve distinct months (sometimes called "Seasons"). Each month is exactly thirty days in length, and each month has an associated constellation which is typically in the sky throughout its duration.

It is important to note that the continents of Xequizas and Monkix are exceptions to the rule of constellations.

Morning Moon:

- This is the first month of the year. It is classified as a winter month. The constellation associated with it is Glaciorion, the Frostwyrn.

World's Dawn:

- This is the second month of the year. It is classified as a winter month. The constellation associated with it is Valora's Heart.

New Harvest:

- This is the third month of the year. It is classified as a spring month. The constellation associated with it is Aqualuna, a Celestial Mermaid.

Mid Spring:

- This is the fourth month of the year. It is classified as a spring month. The constellation associated with it is Zephyrion, the Wind Dancer.

First Harvest:

- This is the fifth month of the year. It is classified as a spring month. The constellation associated with it is Floraquill.

Mid Year:

- This is the sixth month of the year. It is classified as a summer month. The constellation associated with it is Tomaar, the Elder-Grove.

Mid Summer:

- This is the seventh month of the year. It is classified as a summer month. The constellation associated with it is the Astrum Forge.

Second Harvest:

- This is the eighth month of the year. It is classified as a summer month. The constellation associated with it is Lycus.

Sky's Reach:

- This is the ninth month of the year. It is classified as an autumn month. The constellation associated with it is Aeluris.

Last Harvest:

- This is the tenth month of the year. It is classified as an Autumn month. The constellation associated with it is Veras.

World's Dusk:

- This is the eleventh month of the year. It is classified as an Autumn month. The constellation associated with it is Novagloom.

Evening Star:

- This is the twelfth month of the year. It is classified as a winter month. The constellation associated with it is the Veiled Oracle.

Days of the month alongside individual months are sometimes referred to in their ordinal numeration instead of their official reference names.

The order/method of devotion for each day of the week is categorized in the following numerical order (starting from day 10 and back to day 1).

- Day to oneself (10)
- Days of progress (1-6)
- Day to one's family (7)
- Day for rest (8)
- Day to god (9)

In the work week, Days devoted to god and rest are the days least worked in the Second Era.

Week

The beginning of the Second Era was sparked with the creation of the Seven. With their inception, the residents of the world began to question a major tenant which the Seven hold high devotion to. A conversation of progress emerged.

In the end, scholars and devouts of the religion developed a calendar system which would best enable them to create union among the masses while bettering the man in mind and soul.

The following Codes of Fulfillment were made:

- Devote one day to Family.
- Devote one day to Rest.
- Devote one day to God.
- Devote one day to Oneself.
- Devote the rest of your days to Progress.

It is from these Codes of Fulfillment that the ten-day week was made.

There are ten days in each week, with any month consisting of three weeks. The days are arranged in the following order:

- Mortdas (1) - Faaldas (6)
- Mondas (2) - Samdas (7)
- Diemdas (3) - Viendas (8)
- Domedas (4) - Sundas (9)
- Middas (5) - Lūndas (10)

Day

Each day has 24 hours. Some days have special significance such as holidays. (I have not written any yet).
