



TUESDAY 22ND MATCH **BAMBER BRIDGE 1**

In our first Match Replay of the new campaign, we take a short trip to PR5 as AFC Fylde earned a comprehensive win at Bamber Bridge after running out 7-1 winners.

A Charlie Jolley brace, a wondergoal from Max Taylor, and strikes from Danny Ormerod, Lincoln McFayden and two trialists proved the difference as Craig Mahon's side hit Brig for seven on the night.

Charlie Jolley was fast off the mark and tested the Brig 'keeper inside the opening minute, seeing a deflected effort tipped around the post.

Within three minutes, Jolley had his name on the scoresheet. After beating the offside trap, the number seven rounded the Brig goalkeeper before slotting home to put the

New signing Max Taylor went close to doubling the Coasters' lead with a header from a corner, which sailed just over.

Brig had an opportunity just before the 20-minute mark with Harry Scarborough going one-on-one with Fylde's trialist keeper, but the Fylde man did well to keep the effort out.

The hosts did level it up after 25 minutes with Simon Grand getting on the end of a free kick to equalise.

It didn't take long for Fylde to reake the lead, and it was Charlie Jolley once again who ran onto a great ball by Jon Ustabasi and calmly slotted the ball past Dowling to put Fylde back ahead.

Fylde's Trialist 'keeper was called into action just before the interval as he tipped an effort from Emerich Poilly onto the upright before Fylde cleared the danger.

There was three changes at the interval with Zac Jones, Jack Morris and a trialist all being introduced for Craig Mahon's side.

Taelor O'Kane showed a great bit of skill to skip past his man as Fylde searched for a third, but his drilled cross evaded everyone in white.

Just before the hour mark, Max Taylor produced a moment of magic as he took a quick free kick inside his own half, which lobbed the Brig 'keeper to score a wonderful goal and make it 3-1 Fylde.

Fylde made several changes moments after, with the likes of Corey Whelan and Danny Ormerod all getting half an hour under their belts.

Lincoln McFayden was straight into the action and had his name on the scoresheet after a lovely, free-flowing move from Fylde saw the left back slot into the far corner to make it four.

Fylde were scoring goals for fun and quickly added two more to their tally with two trialists getting on the scoresheet. The first was a brilliantly converted finish after Danny Ormerod played the ball across, before another finish at the back post made it six.

There was time for a seventh as Danny Ormerod got in on the act, meeting McFayden's cross from the left and converting to make it seven for the Coasters.

AFC Fylde's first fixture of the 2025/26 National League North season see's Oxford City visit Mill Farm on Saturday afternoon. In what will prove to be Craig Mahon's first competitive game in charge, the Coasters will be hoping to get off to a winning start in the new campaign.

In the opposition dugout for our first test of the new season is former Watford midfielder Ross Jenkins. The 34-year-old starting his player career in Watford, making his competitive debut whilst still an academy scholar in a league cup game against Bristol Rovers. Also an England Under 20 international, Jenkins made nearly 150 appearances as a player before joining Oxford City as a coach.

Following the departure of David Oldfield, Jenkins took temporary charge before earning the job on a full time basis. He won promotion to the fifth tier for the first time in the club's history in 2022/23, defeating St Albans 4-0 in the play-off final, but couldn't keep the Hoops in the division in the season after. After a stint in charge of Boreham Wood, Jenkins returned to Oxford last September and leads the Hoops into the 2025/26 season.



KEY THREE: Tom Scott

A Young midfielder who came through the academy ranks at Sunderland, Scott signed for the Black Cats after catching the eye at Northampton Town.

He made one senior appearance for Sunderland in the EFL Trophy against Manchester United U21's, before signing for Banbury United last summer.

He joined Kettering Town before linking up with Oxford City after impressing on trial.





Josh Parker

Striker Josh Parker dropped out of the EFL for the first time in his career to join Oxford City.

A distinguished career has seen the number nine represent the likes of QPR, Oxford United, Red Star Belgrade, Aberdeen, Gillingham, Charlton Atheltic and Wycombe Wanderers.

He is also a seasoned international for his nation Antigua & Barbuda and has scored five goals and captained the Carribean nation.

Parker hit the ground running at Oxford City, even winning the Vanarama National League South Player of the Month award for a stellar month for the Hoops.



Zac McEachran

McEachran first joined Oxford City as a 17-year-old, however had a brief hiatus across Oxfordshire with Banbury United before rejoining the Hoops.

The highly influential player comes from a family of footballers, with brothers Josh and George playing for Oxford United and Grimsby Town respectively.

He passed 250 appearances for the Hoops in the 2022/23 campaign, and scored important goals in both play-off fixtures in City's promotion season.

Ahead of this season's National League North campaign opener, Charlie Jolley sat down with The Coaster to discuss Pre-Season and the campaign ahead. Jolley joined the Coasters last season, arriving following the expiry of his contract at League Two side Tranmere Rovers.

Prior to that, Jolley came through the ranks at Wigan Athletic, making his Latics debut in May 2019.

Despite being a tough year on the Fylde Coast, Jolley made 11 goal contributions in the National League last season, scoring seven times.

Ahead of the new campaign, Jolley was in impressive form across pre-season. After scoring braces against Lostock St Gerard's and Bamber Bridge, he also added a fifth goal in our final friendly against Lancaster before heading into the season opener.

Speaking on his Pre-Season form, Jolley said: "It's been a good few weeks for me and it's good to get back scoring, but as a team there's still plenty for us to work on.

"The Gaffer is trying to implement his ideas and philosophies and it's up to us to take that on board ahead of the new season which kicks off this weekend.

"I'm 24 and I've played a fair bit of football, so it's on us as the more experienced lads to pass on our knowledge to the younger players which will help us as a collective in the long term."

Jolley has also been recently reunited with his old teammate Chris Merrie. The duo have featured together at both Wigan Athletic and Tranmere Rovers where the pair made a close bond.

Speaking on the arrival of his old friend, Jolley added: "Chris is not only an unbelievable player but an unbelievable person.

"He's a brilliant signing for the football club and I know what Chris can do so I'm buzzing to be back playing with him."

Finally, ahead of getting into competitive action, Jolley concluded: "That's the type of football we're all here to play for (competitive).

"It's a long season so you have to take a game at a time, but we're looking forward to the Oxford game, and we'll hopefully get three points and start the season off on the right foot."

Fylde were in front within 10 minutes after Haughton whipped his free-kick into the top corner prior to Owen Evans' own goal and Jack Stevens' strike turning the clash on its head.

Haughton scored his second free-kick of the afternoon to restore parity 11 minutes after half-time, with Joss Labadie also sent off for the visitors.

The match winning moment came after 83 minutes when Haughton bent a superb strike with his left foot into the top corner to earn the three points.

Corey Whelan led the Coasters out having been named as team captain, whilst new loan signing Patrick Gamble was amongst the substitutes after signing from Blackburn Rovers.

The Coasters' first goal of the campaign came in the 10th minute through Haughton's right-footed free-kick from the left, with his strike curled beyond goalkeeper Laurie Walker and into the top left-corner.

Andy Whing's Moors were back level on 29 minutes when Evans turned Matty Warburton's deflected cross from the left beyond his own goalkeeper Theo Richardson.

Nine minutes later, Fylde were behind after Warburton found Stevens in the box following a passing move, who shot under Richardson and into the bottom right-corner.

Fylde started the second-half on top as they attacked the North Stand. In the opening minutes, Evans won back possession to drive forward and thread Jolley in on goal, but his strike from the left edge of the box was charged down by Clarke.

Fylde were back on terms with 56 minutes played after Ustabasi was fouled on the edge of the box. Haughton struck his right-footed shot low across the turf and under the wall which beat Walker.

Solihull were reduced to 10-men on 58 minutes when referee Elliott Bell dismissed Labadie for a second bookable offence.

Haughton completed his hat-trick on 83 minutes. Following good build-up play, the Coasters' number 10 struck a left-footed bullet into Walker's top right-corner which proved the decisive moment.

The strike proved to be the winner as the Coasters held on through the nine additional minutes to beat Solihull and get three impressive points on the opening day.



FLASHBACK

OXFORD CITY 1-8 AFC FYLDE - 6TH SEPT 2014

In our first Flashback game of the season, we look back on a famous Coasters win as AFC Fylde ran out 8-1 winners over today's visitors back in September 2014.

On what was a memorable Non League Day for Dave Challinor's side, braces from Ritchie Allen, Danny Rowe and Michael Barnes proved a hand in helping Fylde cruise to victory in Oxfordshire.

Richie Allen began the rout in the 13th minute before adding his second three minutes later. The home side pulled one back on 25 minutes through Daren Pond but the two goal deficit was restored by an own goal five minutes later.

Oxford reformed and moved to three at the back making a substitution on 36 minutes and from that point Fylde took full control adding a fourth through Danny Rowe, a fifth from Liam Tomsett and a sixth from Mike Barnes – all before half time.

The goal rush didn't quite carry on into the second half but Fylde still managed another two through Rowe and Barnes to seal an unbelievable victory.

Allen's two strikes came within three minutes of one another, his first being a cool finish after rounding the City 'keeper, before he beat the offside trap and rounded the keeper again to slot home for his second.

After Oxford pulled one back, Fylde hit straight back to restore the two goal advantage, with Adam Sumner's cross being deflected into his own net by Josh Green.

Danny Rowe added a special fourth with a 30-yard free kick which blasted through the wall and past the outstretched Oxford 'keeper, all before Liam Tomsett scored his first for the club with an expert lob first time after reaching a pass from Potts.

Allen almost had his hat-trick before the interval but after his effort was cleared off the line, Barnes gathered the ball and slotted home for number 6 before the break.

With the contest over from then, Fylde added two to their tally in the second 45, with Rowe adding his second of the afternoon, taking the ball down from Ben Hinchcliffe's long punt forward before lobbing Scott to make it seven.

There was time for Fylde to make it eight before the final whistle, with substitute Danny Lloyd sending a great cross towards the back post where Barnes grabbed his brace and Fylde's eighth.





THE TEAM BEHIND

Hello and welcome to today's game against Oxford City! I'm Jack Tomlinson, Head of Football Administration at AFC Fylde. As part of our 'Team Behind the Team' series, I wanted to take this opportunity to introduce myself, share a bit about my journey so far, and explain what I do here at Mill Farm.

My career in football started during my time at the City of Liverpool College, where I studied Business. In my first year, I wrote to nearly every Football Club in the North West asking for work experience—and was fortunate enough to be offered an opportunity at Oldham Athletic, supporting their Club Secretary twice a week. That experience quickly developed into the role of Assistant Secretary and, 12 months later, I was promoted to Club Secretary at Oldham Athletic — making me the youngest Club Secretary in the EFL at the time, aged just 19.

After two years at Oldham, I moved on to Swindon Town as Club Secretary and Player Liaison Officer, before stepping up to League One with Bristol Rovers in the role of Club Secretary.

I joined AFC Fylde in April 2024 as Club Secretary and in May 2025, became the Head of Football Administration.

In the build-up to home fixtures like today's game against Oxford City, our Fixture Secretary, Phil Heald, and I liaise closely with the Match Officials and the opposition club to confirm fixture details, kit colours, supporter arrangements, and complete all pre-match documentation. This is then shared internally to make sure everything runs smoothly on matchdays.

For away matches, I coordinate travel logistics — booking the team coach, pre-match meals where applicable and hotel accommodation where required. I work closely with our Head Coach and Head of Performance to ensure all arrangements meet their needs, helping to give the squad the best possible preparation.

I'm also responsible for drafting all Player contracts, Transfer Agreements, and Loan Agreements. When we're looking to bring a player in, I work with our Director of Football to ensure all agreed-upon terms are accurately reflected. Once signed, the paperwork is uploaded to the FA and National League systems for approval, and the player is registered and assigned a squad number

Additionally, Phil and I monitor player discipline and eligibility to keep our Coaching Staff informed when a player is nearing or serving a suspension.

I hope this has shown an insight into my role, and I'm thoroughly enjoying my role here at Mill Farm. We're all very excited to get back into the swing and things, and we're hopeful of getting off to a good start on the pitch this afternoon against Oxford City.

Thank you for your continued support — we hope you enjoy today's game and the season ahead!




