senior online dating sites have popped up recently, such as OurTime which is owned by Match.com, but you can still find a large pool of singles — as well as those who are younger if that's your ideal — on the larger online dating powerhouses. Here's a breakdown of what the top sites offer to help you decide which is right for you.

**Chemistry.com:** Operating a bit differently from the competition, Chemistry.com does not let users search for or browse other profiles. Instead, after you complete your profile and a thorough personality test, the website will send you up to 5 new matches per day and provide detailed information on your common interests and reasons for the match. If both parties indicate interest, a four-stage communication process begins that takes you from indicating mutual interests all the way to a casual date facilitated by Chemistry.com in a public, mutually accessible location. For seniors worried about exposing themselves to too many strangers or wanting a slow approach, this is the perfect site because of its close focus on building a true match before the first date. Keep in mind, you cannot view the profiles or communicate with your matches without a subscription. The cheapest plan is 3 months for \$13.33/month.

**Match.com:** Arguably the most well-known of the dating websites out there, Match.com offers robust search options to help you find interesting matches. Profile creation is free and you can send a free "wink" to someone that you are interested in, but in order to communicate you will have to upgrade to a paid subscription. The cheapest plan is \$12.79/month for a 1-year subscription, but it offers a number of options. Narrowing down exactly what you want and counting on Match.com to find it for you is easy with its matching service, if you know what you're looking for. If you have specific desires, such as a vegan Christian or someone without children who loves cats, this is a great option for you.

**eHarmony:** Famous for their free communication weekends, eHarmony is the site to use if you are looking for a committed relationship. Their introductory personality quiz is designed to weed out those who do not align with the overall desires of the community of singles, which can be a relief for some and a problem for others as some potential romance-seekers may be rejected from profile creation. Similarly to Chemistry.com, eHarmony does not allow you to browse through profiles on the website and instead only lets you browse through those that have been identified as matches through their system. However, unlike the other two you can view your matches' profiles before subscribing, though you have to be a paying member to see their photos or communicate. It is also the easiest on your wallet — a 24-month subscription is just \$11.95/month. Seniors who are looking for a lasting, committed relationship in their online dating experience will benefit greatly from using eHarmony.


