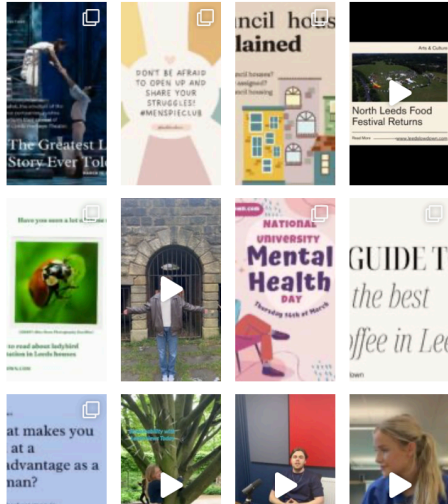
National University Mental Health Day returns to Leeds

The sold out show gained immense positive feedback from local fans of the West Yorkshire band.

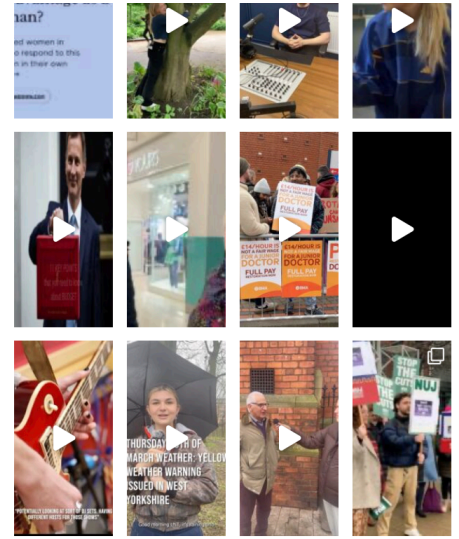
