Avalon Housing, Ann Arbor, has received an honorable mention in the 17th-Annual Maxwell Awards of Excellence sponsored by the Fannie Mae Foundation and the Partnership to End Long Term Homelessness. Avalon Housing was also awarded a \$10,000 grant from the foundation to continue its work in the field of supportive housing for homeless families.

FH Martin Constructors, Warren, accepted a safety excellence award from the Associated General Contractors of Michigan. The award is presented to companies who achieve outstanding safety
