WHAT IS CLIMATE CHANGE?

A change in global or regional climate patterns caused by the increasing levels of greenhouse gases in the atmosphere since the Industrial Revolution, as a result of the use of fossil fuels.

Pollutants such as carbon dioxide and methane contribute to these greenhouse gases.

WAYS WE CAN HELP:

- Use your voice—urgent action is needed to hold leaders accountable and promote positive change, including speaking up to the right people.
- Be informed—this is effective and influences others, as it equips individuals with knowledge and actionable insights.
- Be political—Political engagement goes beyond voting and young age. Young people are working together to demand change. Hold politicians accountable by contacting local MPs or attending meetings.
- Travel responsibly—Travel responsibly by walking, cycling, or using trains to reduce carbon emissions. Travel closer to home and avoid pet-feeding or unnatural animal interactions. Support local conservation projects and observe animals in their natural habitat.



WAYS WE CAN HELP (CONT.):

- Eat sustainably—Food production contributes to wildlife extinction and 60% of global biodiversity loss. Eating plant-based diets, such as vegetarian and vegan options, can lower environmental impact.
- Reduce your waste—Reducing food waste and composting can help reduce environmental impact and preserve marine life.
- Watch what you buy—Be mindful of our purchases and sources to save money, reduce waste, and improve our environmental footprint, supporting eco-friendly products and sustainable production.
- Volunteer—Volunteering in local nature reserves offers conservation experience and a chance to kickstart a career in conservation through youth internships worldwide.
