The Harold Lloyd Awards: **Barbara Bratone**

Barbara Bratone has always been there when The Picture House has needed a leader, a soldier, a guide... or a magician. She brought the benefit of her 30 years of experience as a fundraiser and not-for-profit executive to her Board service and to her two terms as executive director.

She started her career as a volunteer when, in 1974, she helped found The Pelham Art Center, raised the money to launch the project and served as the organization's first executive director. Barbara went on to work in development for The Phelps Stokes Fund, The Ms. Foundation for Women, The Caribbean Cultural Center and The Bishop Tutu

Scholarship Fund. She served as the executive director of The La Napoule Art Foundation and in 1989 as the founding executive director of The American Indian College Fund. Her last position before retiring was as a consultant to the Ford Foundation advising them on fundraising for Project GRAD a national educational initiative. In 1998 she was named Charity Fundraising Executive of the Year by the National Federation of Nonprofits

Barbara became active after "retirement" with The Picture House, helping the organization raise the funds to purchase the movie theater in 2003, serving as the executive director in 2004 and 2005—and then again in 2012-2014 while



simultaneously opening and operating Bistro Rollin, the well-regarded French restaurant in Pelham, with her husband Arthur. Under Barbara's leadership the theater found its footing and became the thriving film center we celebrate this evening.

She has once again retired. We can't wait to see what astounding accomplishments come next!

The Harold Lloyd Awards

The Picture House Regional Film Center is honored to present The Harold Lloyd Awards, named in honor of Harold Lloyd, an outstanding turn-of-the-century actor, comedian, film director, film producer, screenwriter, and stunt performer. Lloyd made nearly 200 comedy films, both silent and "talkies", between 1914 and 1947 and did significant film work in Westchester. Perhaps he saw a few films at the Pelham Picture House...



Arts Education: Helping students Find their Find their Voice

Whether it's an in-school residency, a movie-making class at the theater, or a documentary film-making program at an under-served school or community group, the education program at The Picture House helps students develop a deep respect for the power of cinema as an art form and its capacity to expand their sense of the world.

Even more than that, these classes enable students to discover their voices through the lens of the camera. Film is a form of media that unlocks creativity and expression.

Classes are designed to help students express themselves and build

confidence – outcomes that will last long after the final credits roll. Research shows conclusively that students who receive arts education perform better in school, have better workforce opportunities, and are more likely to volunteer in their communities.

RESEARCH SHOWS THAT EXPOSURE TO THE ARTS:

- Improves high school graduation rates: Students from low-income families actively engaged in the arts have only a 4% dropout rate as opposed to the 22% dropout rate of students with little to no arts exposure.

- Develops media literacy: The key to education in the 21st century and to understanding the myriad images we absorb every day.
- Opens career paths: 72% of employers say creativity is the number 1 skill they seek when hiring.
- Fosters self-esteem through empowering students to share their own perspectives.
- Nurtures personal qualities, such as leadership, teamwork, and perseverance, that build resilience and position students for long term success.
