

Automotive trades are always in demand, he added. Adding that trade workers are always going to be in need isvery important for, people will always need their car fixed or their airplanes to fly.


"I will go straight into the industry because mechanics are needed, there are jobs constantly waiting, and skilled workers are in such high demand," Friesen said.
