## Boy, 15, stabbed at Sloane Square Tube by duo on motorbike

outside a busy Tube station in an upmarket area of London yesterday by two men on a motorbike.

An air ambulance was called to treat the boy – who was still

Witnesses claimed that the

teenager had been stabbed in the back, and that the suspects started to chase him into the Tube station but then ran away. leaving behind their motorbike and a weapon.

The boy was treated at the scene by paramedics before

being taken to hospital. Scotland Yard said last night that his injuries were 'not life-threatening or life-changing'.

Sloane Square is an upmarket shopping area in the Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea – at the end of the famous King's Road and which gave its name to the fashion-able Sloane Rangers of the 80s - where the average house price is more than £2 million.

Sloane Square Station was closed in the aftermath of the incident and the area cordoned off as police investigated. No

arrests have been made. A local employee, who did not wish to be named, told the Mail: 'The schoolboy ran inside the station for help. It was horrific. He

looked young, like a baby.'
Another added: 'I heard five or six screams – the noise was horrible. The two guys who attacked him followed him into the station but came back out there must have been too many people. They tried to escape on their motorbike but it wouldn't start so they left it and ran.
