Program Highlights and Impact



Medical & Mental Health Services

For many years, Little Flower's Mental Health team has been a state leader in the implementation of new evidence-based clinical therapies for children. Our organization is the number one provider in New York State for Home and Community-Based Services.

With the help of our Innovation Fund, Little Flower was able to purchase the equipment needed to implement Neurofeedback and Eye Movement Desensitization and Reprocessing, a therapy that uses brainwave technology to help children with trauma symptoms. Little Flower is the first organization in our area to utilize this cutting-edge and highly effective therapy.

After being awarded a competitive State contract last year, we were able to implement a new evidence-based therapy model, Parent-Child Interaction Therapy (PCIT).



Adults with Developmental Disabilities

For over 40 years, Little Flower has provided quality community-based alternatives to institutions for individuals with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities across Brooklyn, Queens, and Long Island. Our person-centered approach helps individuals maximize their potential through dedicated professional support.

The cornerstone of our services is the Family Care program, where adults live with certified providers who offer supportive family environments. These homes foster meaningful relationships and community engagement while ensuring individuals receive necessary support. All homes are state-certified and regularly monitored, upholding our commitment to treating every person with dignity and respect.

Program Highlights and Impact



Residential Treatment Center

Our Residential Treatment Center is a therapeutic community that uses a trauma-informed, multi-systemic approach to providing youth with quality care and support to address their emotional, behavioral and mental health needs.

Thanks to supporters like you, Little Flower has been able to expand our reach by partnering with the community to offer extracurricular activities for our youth. From workshops like financial literacy, yoga sessions, music classes, cooking workshops, our youth benefit greatly. The youth show reduced symptoms of anxiety, improved overall mood and self-esteem as well as gaining life-skills.

The youth at RTC enjoyed several events, field trips and celebrations over the year. The annual spring formal, an on-campus Pride parade, and a donor-hosted taco party, are just a few ways we come together to celebrate.



Family Foster Care Program

Little Flower seeks exceptional individuals willing to provide love, care, and support to children separated from their families. Foster parents play a vital role in nurturing these young people while working toward family reunification. The organization is dedicated to finding both kinship and foster caregivers who can create stable, loving environments where children can flourish.

Throughout the fostering journey, Little Flower provides comprehensive training and support services to help caregivers succeed. While the primary goal is to reunite children with their biological families, when this isn't possible, the organization works to find permanent solutions through kinship care or adoption.

Our Fair Futures program provides one-on-one coaching, social-emotional, academic, career, housing, and life skills supports to youth aging out of the foster system.

St. John's Residence for Boys

St. John's Residence for Boys, a legal affiliate of Little Flower as of 2019, achieved many significant goals in 2024 including the opening of several new programs in Brooklyn.

St. John's has both a Non-Secure Placement (NSP) residence on our main campus in Rockaway Park and a Limited Secure Placement (LSP) residence in Brooklyn that provide long-term, residential and supportive services for youth placed by Family Court. The programs are connected to the city-wide initiative called "Close to Home" which allows young people who have been involved with the justice system to be treated and rehabilitated closer to their communities. The goal of the programs are to keep parents closely involved to ensure success when their child returns home.

The Transitional Residential Care (TRC) Program at St. John's offers short-term comprehensive support for youth aged 17 to 21 who have completed their court mandates and demonstrated readiness for independent living. These youth transition from NSP or LSP Programs while awaiting a committed permanency resource or plan.

Participants in St. John's programs benefit from our Fair Futures framework, a program that delivers critical resources and guidance to support their transition to adulthood.

From day one, St. John's provides thorough case planning, fair futures support and dedicated aftercare services, ensuring each youth has the tools, skills, and support to thrive as an independent and empowered member of the community. By combining structured support with opportunities for personal growth, the program sets youth on a path toward a successful future.





He says, "Cooking is just experimenting with different flavors, and if you do it the right way, it will taste great."

The Brennans' story is a beautiful reminder of the true meaning of the holidays—love, kindness, and giving.




Bringing Holiday Cheer
