


ira is also the starting point of several hiking trails, including the famous Fira to Oia hike. This trail offers amazing views along the caldera and takes you to the neighboring




languages, including English.







Discover hidden gems and local icons. Delight in ancient Aegean traditions and indulge in the locals' favorite flavors. While you're wandering through the vibrant markets and breathtaking vistas be sure to explore the things that make these places globally renowned. Here's a cheat sheet on the best of the best.

MASCOT OF MYKONOS

If you see a pelican walking amongst a crowd of people in Mykonos Town, that's totally normal. In 1958, a fisherman found a wounded pelican, nursed him back to health and set him free. But he decided to hang out around town. Locals named him "Petros," which translates to old and grumpy in Greek. Petros died in 1985, but he was so well-loved that three pelicans were brought to Mykonos Town to continue his legacy.



SPECIALTY COCKTAIL ANYONE?

Rakomelo is a Greek liqueur derived from two types of grape brandy, honey and spices. High in antioxidants, it's traditionally been used as a home remedy for a sore throat or cough. It's usually served warm on a Winter day, but in the Summer, you'll usually find it mixed into a refreshing cocktail.



HANDMADE JEWELRY

Mykonian-style jewelry mixes gold-tone precious metals with deep colored gemstones, creating patterns and hues that bring glamour and playfulness to your look. Charms and pendants like eyes, olive leaves, an spirals add the allure. You won't have to travel far on Mykonos to find beautiful jewelry. The island is filled with stores and vendors featuring a wide spectrum of designs at varying price points.







Ouzo is Greece's national drink. Produced exclusively in Greece, it is said to date all the way back to the 14th century, where monks on Mount Athos first distilled the anise flavored spirit. It's often served with water, as mixing Ouzo with water helps bring out the fragrances and gives it it's milky white appearance. Take home a bottle and remember your epic time on the Greek Isles.



Turkish delight, or as it's called locally - "Rahat Lokum," is the quintessential Turkish confection. Small, cubed, sweet and sprinkled with powdered sugar, it's found in almost all corners of Turkey. Legend has it that the soft candy was created for the Sultan of Turkey because he complained about breaking his teeth on hard candy. Fast-forward about 250 years, and Turkish delight is still putting smiles on peoples' faces, with teeth intact.



SPICE IT UP

Cumin, Oregano, Coriander, Dill, Turmeric, Cinnamon... the smells fill the air. As you stroll through the streets of Kusadasi, you'll see colorful spices and herbs for sale everywhere!! THE BLUE EYE

A popular symbol in Greek culture, the blue eye is said to ward off the evil eye and bring good luck. The blue color is thought to represent calmness and serenity. You can find bracelets and necklaces adorned with this simple, yet strong eye charm, all over the island of Santorini.

OLIVE OIL SOAP

Olive oil is a staple ingredient in most Mediterranean dishes, and in Greece, that's no exception. But it's uses go beyond what you'll find on the kitchen table. Pick up some olive oil soap, full of healthy vitamins to give your skin that extra glow.



CERAMIC ARTS

Pottery is thought to have existed in the ancient city of Ephesus since 6,000 BC, giving Kusadasi, and Turkey as a whole, quite a deep history in the ceramic arts. Today, Turkish pottery is distinguished by shell strength and rich colors, which do not fade and are said to last centuries. Walk over to Hacivat Shop in Kusadasi, for the most incredible selection of stunning Turkish pottery.



WORRY NOT!!

Just like Ouzo... Komboloi, or Greek worry beads, are said to have originated with monks on Mount Athos. However nowadays, the beads are not used for religious purpose, but for fun! There is an art and style to creating specific movements with the beads while holding them in your hands. If you can master moves like the "repeater" and the "fake grip change" while you're at Club... you'll pass for a local wherever you go!

Greek honey is regarded as some of the best in the world. Why? Because the Agean Summers present the most perfect conditions for beekeeping...nearly unlimited sun and low humidity. In the Santorini markets, look for a local raw thyme honey, like the Santomeli brand.

TURKISH LEATHER

Turkey is one of the world's top producers of highquality leather goods, and what separates Turkish leather from the rest is the quality of the raw ingredients and the attention to detail during the production process. It's a Turkish industry that can trace its roots all the way back to the 12th century. You'll find jackets, shoes, sandals and all different types of leather bags as fine examples of this centuries-old Turkish tradition.



Vibrant crimson colored Cherry Santorini tomatoes, or tomatines, are unique because they don't grow anywhere else in the world, and their taste comes from the island's rich volcanic soil. They were once so sought after on the island that they were even used as currency. Enjoy them in a traditional Tomatokeftedes (tomato fritter), with a dip of Tzatziki.
