A LEICESTERSHIRE woman who suffers from a chronic neurological condition is preparing to run the London Landmarks Half-Marathon to honour her dad, who has had a brain tumour removed.

Originally from Rothley, Naomi Lowe will race on Sunday, April 6, and has just beaten her £2,000 target for the Brain Tumour Charity.

Gary, Naomi's dad, was signed up to run the half-marathon last year for Loros, before he fell ill and was unable to take part.

Naomi said: "It turned out the symptoms that stopped him doing the marathon last year were because of his brain tumour.

"He had his tumour removed and then I saw an advert for the London Landmarks Half-Marathon and thought, my dad couldn't do it last year, so let's see if I can do it this year.

"I got a place and decided we'd raise money for the Brain Tumour Charity for dad."

Despite developing symptoms last April, Gary, 56, from Thurmaston, was determined to still raise money for the Leicester hospice, having had to learn how to walk again.

"I still managed to raise thousands for Loros," he said. "I walked 13.1 miles round Watermead country park in two halves, on a Saturday and Sunday."

After his diagnosis, Gary initially spent 10 days in hospital on medication to reduce swelling. A five-hour operation to remove his tumour followed on June 20 - where he woke

Finally, Gary was well enough to go back to Leicester's General Hospital, where he stayed on the neurorehabilitation ward, having spent a 16 weeks in three different hospitals over the course of the last year.



He has no skull due to the surgery, so wears a helmet every day to protect his head.

"If I don't wear my hat and I fall, it's game over," said Gary.

'I've got a squidgy head, because I've got no skull.

"It's been a long journey, thankfully I don't remember most of it, but my wife and kids do. I'm still halfway through that journey."

Over Christmas, Gary completed a six-week course of radiotherapy to "kill off" the remaining 5 per cent of

In April he will have another MRI scan to determine if the tumour has gone or stopped growing.

"It's been mixed emotions," said Gary. "We've tried to laugh about it like most things, because we're an open family. But I cried like I've never cried before.

"I don't suffer from my mental health, but 16 weeks in hospital was beginning to take its toll on me.

"All the rehab departments at the General Hospital were amazing and they would've kept me there for another four, five weeks, but I'd had enough. They agreed to let me go as long as I promised to do my exer-

Gary remembers very little of the whole experience, but despite this, thanks the NHS for "saving his life".

"It's scary that I've had to learn to walk again," says Gary. "You can't envisage having to learn to walk."

Naomi herself suffers with fibromyalgia, a neurological chronic condition, that causes widespread pain. fatigue and tenderness in the mus-
