NOSTALGIC NEW SHOW 'WELFARE' COMING TO DERBY THEATRE THIS AUTUMN 2024

Derby Theatre is thrilled to announce the world premiere of *Welfare*, a heart-warming and hilarious new play by award-winning British-Armenian playwright Abi Zakarian. The anticipated production will debut on Saturday 28 September 2024 - Saturday 12 October 2024 in Derby Theatre's Main House.

Derby Theatre will be transformed into the historic Derbyshire Miners' Holiday camp in Skegness, where audiences will follow generations as they seek refuge together at the Miners' Convalescent Home. The play explores the evolution of the camp, originally a convalescent home for miners, and later a beloved holiday destination for Derbyshire miners and their families. Through the eyes of a family spanning generations, *Welfare* dives into the highs and lows of history, examining the impact of time and change on communities and individuals alike.

Welfare is a celebration of resilience, community and the pursuit of joy during 1950's Britain. Audiences can expect a rich tapestry of brass band music, rousing speeches, entertainment and a whole lot of bingo, all contributing to an immersive theatrical experience.

About the Abi Zakarian:

Award-winning playwright Abi Zakarian was born and raised in Derby to Armenian parents, often influencing her writing, bringing diverse perspectives to her narratives.

Welfare is a tribute to Abi's Derby roots and to the rich history of the Derbyshire Miners' Holiday Camp in Skegness. Drawing from her local upbringing, Zakarian weaves a narrative that reflects the resilience and camaraderie of the mining community. Alongside her own upbringing, Zakarian ensured Welfare drew on as much real-life experience as possible, visiting Skegness in October 2023 as research for the project. The Derby Theatre group met with individuals from the Derbyshire community who previously holidayed at the Miners' Holiday Camp, sharing photos, memorabilia and precious memories. With this play, she brings to life the stories of those who sought refuge, demanded hope and pursued joy, making it a personal and evocative piece.
