Established first as Assumption High School, our roots and our history of building disciples of Jesus Christ in the Dominican tradition of Prayer, Study, Community, and Service has been at the center of all we have done through our years in existence.

There is no greater moment in our school year than that of Graduation. Just as Graduation serves as our greatest tradition and celebration, the Living Rosary is another St. Dominic tradition lived out annually. The Living Rosary has occurred the first week of May for the past 28 years honoring the Blessed Mother. The living rosary originated from one of our Dominican Sisters, Sister Jeanne Margaret Stoltz. Sister Jeanne was celebrating her 50th Jubilee of becoming a Dominican Sister and wanted only to pray the rosary as a school community. Thus came the idea of praying a Living Rosary. Sr. Jeanne was our school librarian for 40 years. The learning commons is named in her honor. Sr. Jeanne, now in her 90's, continues to pray for our school daily from the mother house in Sparkhill, NY

I hope this issue of the Dominican provides you an inside look at the many great traditions, celebrations, honors, and most importantly families that make St. Dominic High School a very special community. It is through these many people and experiences that our students come to know Jesus Christ and they continue to develop into disciples. May God bless you and your loved ones this summer. CONGRATS, GRADUATES!

The 203 Class of 2023 Graduates closed the chapter to their high school careers this past May.

ay 17, 2023 can be remembered as a beatiful evening as the St. Dominic community celebrated the Class of 2023. Parents, grandparents and other family members were filled with joy and pride, while the graduates felt a sense accomplishment along with excitement for what their futures have in store beyond the Crusader halls. Over 1,000 attendees including the graduates, their families, and the St. Dominic faculty and administration gathered at Crusader Stadium to celebrate this year's commencement.

Out of the 123 students who graduated with honors, 20 students graduated Summa Cum Laude and 34 earned Magna Cum Laude. In the group of graduates, one earned the distinguised honor of becoming a Missouri Scholars 100. **Anna Burcham** is one of the top 100 in the state to earn this award showcasing academic excellence.

Along with academic excellence, the Class of 2023 had a school record amount of student-athletes who committed to participate in athletics at the next level. 29 St. Dominic seniors signed their National Letter of Intent this past spring.

After St. Dominic, 94% of the class plans to continue on to 4 year universities or colleges, 4% will be attending trade schools, and 2% have jumped into the work force.

Two graduates who had the opportunity to speak during the commencement shared their reflections on their time at St. Dominic, and being a part of the Class of 2023.



It has truly been an honor and a privilege to be a part of this class. The memories along with the friendships I have made over these last four years will forever hold a very special place in my heart. Becoming more involved in the

DOMINICAN TRADITIONS

THE LIVING ROSARY CONTINUES, CELEBRATING SPECIAL STAFF MILESTONES.

The tradition of the Living Rosary has been a constant at St. Dominic for 28 years. During this ceremony, a "live" rosary is made up of students and teachers holding candles representing each bead of the Rosary. As each decade is prayed aloud, the candles are lit until the entire rosary is complete. Around the display, the entire student body, faculty, staff and family guests pray the rosary together. This tradition was started in 1995, in honor of Sr. Jeanne Margaret Stoltz, OP's 50th Jubilee.

At the time, the St. Dominic President, Fr. Robert Finn, asked Sr. Jeanne how she would like to celebrate her jubilee as a school community. "Praying the Rosary!" was her response.

The Blessed Mother inspired me to ask that all the students pray the rosary together. We had never done that! As we know, the rosary was a great gift of the Blessed Mother and to St. Dominic. A few weeks later

I walked into the gym to see forty students and ten teachers seated on chairs forming a huge circle on the gym floor and the bleachers filled with the students. A large statue of Mary was at the front. I was speechless at the sight. It is a scene that I will never forget! I hope Mary continues to bless each one who prayed the rosary in the gym that day. THE EISENBATH FAMILY

CRUSADER FAMILY TREE is a regular feature that profiles longtime St. Dominic and Assumption High School families, exploring how their roots intertwine with ours.

The Eisenbath roots run deep in Josephville, Missouri. In fact, if you find yourself on Hwy P in Josephville, you're bound to pass by Eisenbath Road - where the original family home still stands. Urban and Irene (Wilmes) Eisenbath, moved into the farmhouse built by Urban's parents, standing on his grandparents' land. This land was settled by early members of the family, who established themselves in Josephville as early as the 1840s as farmers - immigrating from Germany. Urban and Irene followed the family footsteps of farming while raising their 16 children.

The family connection to the Crusader community began when Marvin Eisenbath and his brother Bernard Eisenbath attended St. Dominic as members of the

Class of 1970. The brothers had 4 older siblings, with 10 of their younger siblings following the two through St. Dominic High School.

Marvin credits his mother, Irene, with encouragement from the priest at Josephville Parish, for why he, Bernard and his younger siblings attended St. Dominic. A decision he is very grateful for. The Catholic faith was very important to Marvin's mother, and it was important that her children were surrounded by this throughout their high school education. Marvin and his siblings understood the importance of the high school experience St. Dominic offered, and after graduation, this stuck with them.

Marvin met his wife Donna as they both worked in the food distribution industry. He and Donna successfully built their own company from scratch, Fair Market Inc. They started their business in their home in 1987. Marvin says it took hard work, building up day by day, and over 30 years later, they have a successful company to look back on.

Together they have four children, and now have grandchildren who attend or have gone through St. Dominic. Julie (Eisenbath) and Tom Bell are parents to Jordyn '11, Elaina '20, Jackson '22 and future Crusader Macie '30. Marvin and Donna have a strong and constant relationship with St. Dominic, as past parents, current grandparents, and also as avid Crusader Football supporters! Both have staved involved in major projects and campaigns, helping shape how St. Dominic has grown throughout history. Crusader PRAYER WARRIORS

Many grandparents are frequent visitors to St. Dominic's campus, joining together to pray the rosary over their grandchildren and the entire St. Dominic community.



The Holy Spirit is what ignited the establishment of the Grandmother's Rosary, today known as the Grandparent's Rosary. This tradition was started in 2014, where grandmothers of St. Dominic students could use the chapel to gather and pray the Rosary together. Whether someone has a current grandchild at St. Dominic, or are grandparents to an alumni, all are welcome to join in prayer.

The main focus of Grandparent's Rosary is for it to be a simple way for the Crusader community to come together in a spiritual gathering, to honor Mother Mary, while praying over the student body, faculty and staff, and entire St. Dominic community.



In 2017, the large statue of Mary, the Lady of the Rosary was added to the chapel. A regular Rosary participant, Michael Blevins, was very passionate about the Blessed Mother Mary and the Rosary. He was a very skilled craftsman, and devoted much of his time making rosaries by

hand. The current rosary that the Lady of the Rosary statue holds was hand crafted and donated by Mr. Blevins. As the rosary participation grew, a few additions were added to this program, with a goal to bring our Crusader families together through our faith. In 2020 the name of the monthly gatherings officially became Grandparents Mass & Rosary. Mass was now offered before the Rosary was prayed, so that many would not have to rush from their parishes to St. Dominic. After the rosary, grandparents are invited to enjoy donuts and coffee with their grandchild, in between class exchanges. This new set up has allowed grandparents to spend time together, grow stronger in their faith together, both with each other and with their grandchildren.




