The policy highlights from local and national public libraries below specifically address managing patron belongings. Additional related topics were not highlighted, but also included: sleeping, bathing in bathrooms, requirements for shirts/pants/shoes, accompanied animals, and body odor, which are areas that Harrington Library staff also address.

- A customer may not leave a personal belonging unattended in the library.
- The library is not responsible for a lost, stolen, or misplaced personal item, whether the item was attended or unattended by the owner.
- A customer who brings a personal item in the library assumes the risk of loss or theft of the item.

- Using wheeled devices inside the Library or on Library grounds, except in designated areas, including use of skateboards, roller skates, bicycles, motorized or non-motorized scooters, and shopping carts. These restrictions do not apply to ADA assistive devices or baby strollers.

- Library Users may not bring in any items that interfere with library operations, create a safety or health hazard, deny space to other customers, block aisles, or block access to or exits from the building.
- Library Users may not store personal belongings on Library property or leave personal belongings unattended.
- Library Users may not use wheeled devices in the Library including skateboards, roller skates, bicycles, scooters, shopping carts, walkers, or strollers except for items necessary for medical purposes or to take care of an accompanying child.

Los Angeles –

- Bicycles, shopping carts, or other large wheeled conveyances are not permitted inside library buildings. Wheelchairs and strollers are only permitted if being used for the transport of an adult or child. Skates, skateboards, and collapsible scooters must be carried while on library premises.
- The Library is not responsible for personal items that are lost, stolen or damaged in or on the grounds of the library.

San Jose Library -

 Bringing bicycles, unicycles, tricycles or other similar conveyances into library facilities, or leaving such conveyances at the entry or exit areas in a manner that blocks ingress or egress.
 This regulation does not apply to wheelchairs, other medical devices, or strollers, or other similar devices, provided they are utilized and stored in a manner that does not restrict public access.

- Camping in library facilities or on library grounds. "Camping" refers to the use of library property for lying down, sleeping in a reclined position, living or accommodation purposes.
- Leaving personal items unattended in the library is always unwise. Unattended items may be removed

- Bringing in bags in excess of 9" L x 14" W x 22" H. Customers are permitted to bring in two bags per person, but each bag must be smaller than 9" L x 14" W x 22" H. Items must fit easily into a measuring box of the above dimensions. Infested personal items are also prohibited. If a customer is attending a private event, bag(s) may exceed the size restrictions because host(s) is expected to provide coat and bag check service.
- Placing items or personal belongings on or against buildings, furniture, equipment or fixtures in a manner that interferes with library staff or customer use of the library, or leaving personal belongings unattended.
- Bringing bicycles, or other similar items inside library buildings, including, but not limited to, vestibules or covered doorways. Operating bicycles or other similar items in a reckless or inattentive manner on library premises.
- Operating roller skates, skateboards, hover boards, or other similar items in, or on, library premises.
- Leaving mess, garbage or spills or creating mess, garbage or spills that disrupts or interferes with library use

The following items are not permitted in the Library:

- Carts, large bags, bags on wheels, backpacks, or collections of bags that are in excess of 24" x 16" x 10", excluding strollers.
- Strollers when not intended for use with babies and infants.
- Any personal items that appear to be infested or have a foul odor that disturbs other persons.
- Bicycles or motorized vehicles. Individuals with mobility impairments are permitted to use wheelchairs, walkers, and other appropriate mobility aids on Library premises.
- Non-motorized skates, skateboards, and collapsible scooters (except when carried).
- Weapons of any kind.

Some Library locations may have additional restrictions.

- Bringing shopping carts or wheeled conveyances into the building, with the exception of wheelchairs and baby strollers/ carriages used for the actual transport of a person or child or wheeled backpacks and book carriers not exceeding 24"x15"x12" (excluding handles).
- Bringing sleeping bags, bed-rolls, or blankets into the building (blankets for small children are acceptable).

- People, animals or property must not block aisles, doorways, stairways, elevators or ramps.
 Large objects such as carts, bicycles and luggage may not be brought into library facilities.
 Library patrons must keep personal belongings with them at all times.
- Roller skates, scooters, skateboards, bicycles, or other similar devices must not be used on Library property.
- Library entrance areas shall be used exclusively for entering and exiting the library and as temporary waiting areas for library patrons.

Category A (Library Specific Violation)

- Leaving packages, backpacks, luggage, or any other personal items unattended. These unattended items are subject to immediate confiscation.
- Using wheeled devices inside the Library or on Library grounds, except in designated areas, including use of skateboards, roller skates, bicycles, motorized or non-motorized scooters, and shopping carts that are larger than allowed by the restriction on allowable articles. These restrictions do not apply to ADA assistive devices or baby strollers.
- Bringing in items excluding personal items (purse, laptop, briefcase) that occupy floor space in excess of 14"W x 17"H x 20"L. Items are measured in totality and must be placed and fit easily into a measuring box of the above dimensions.
