

EDITING TIPS YOU CAN APPLY TO LIFE

1

LEARN

Before editing a word, an editor tries to understand the writer's goals. Life lesson: The more you listen, the more knowledge you receive.

READ

An editor searches for the main idea the writer is trying to convey. Life lesson: People want to be heard. Practice listening.

3

FIND THE CALL TO ACTION

Editors search for a call to action and ensure it's prominent. Life lesson: What purpose drives your life? What pushes you from the comfort zone?

WHO IS THE TARGET AUDIENCE?

Editors always ask writers this. Life lesson: You can't be all things to everyone. You can mean something amazing to at least one person.

WHAT IS THE POINT OF VIEW?

Editors search for this when editing. Life lesson: Knowing someone's viewpoint may help avoid or minimize communication road blocks.

6

CHOOSE A STYLE

Editors choose style guides to edit content for various formats. Life lesson: Discover your personal style. Respect the style of others.

7

FOLLOW BEST PRACTICES

Editors learn from mentors, friends and colleagues. Life lesson: Get a mentor. Study the work of experts; your skill level will grow.

8

KNOW THE BRAND

Some editing projects require brand guidelines that editors must incorporate for brand identity. Life lesson: Establish personal convictions. Cling to them.

9

PROOF THE WORK

Editors like to step away briefly from the work so they can come back with fresh eyes. Life lesson: Give yourself time to gain a new perspective.



BUILD RELATIONSHIPS

Writers seek out the best editors because they trust them. Life lesson: Who seeks you out? Who trusts you?
