

Google confronts an existential threat Monday as the U.S. government tries to break up the company as punishment for turning its revolutionary search engine into a ruthless monopoly. The drama will unfold in a Washington courtroom during the next three weeks during hearings that will determine how the company should be penalized for operating an illegal monoply in search.

NEW YORK (AP) — A newly discovered green comet tracked by telescopes has likely broken apart as it swung by the sun, dashing hopes of a naked-eye spectacle. Comet SWAN, hailing from the Oort Cloud beyond Pluto, has been visible through telescopes and binoculars over the past few weeks with its streaming tail, but experts said it may not have survived its recent trip past the sun and is fading fast.

In 2004, Troy Victorino, Jerone Hunter, Michael Salas and Robert Cannon were convicted in what has been dubbed the "Xbox Murderers." The foursome killed six roommates and a dog inside a Deltona, Florida home. Prosecutors claimed the motive behind the killings was to retrieve an Xbox that was claimed to have been stolen.

Victorino and Hunter were sentenced to death while Salas and Cannon received life in prison.



That is not the end of the story, however. In 2016, the United States Supreme Court found Florida's death penalty sentencing statute unconstitutional under the Sixth Amendment in Hurst v. Florida. This required any death penalty sentence to be unanimous, which Victorino and Hunter's was not. Anyone sentenced after 2002 was eligible for a new

Their resentencing trial was initially scheduled for 2023, but changes in the state's death penalty which requires an 8-4 jury vote as opposed to a unanimous one resulted in the judge declaring a mistrial.

Now jury selection for the pair's resentencing trial began Monday, April 21. They will once again face the possibility of the jury determine that a death sentence is appropriate.


The Forest

Irving Locker - D-day, Battle of the Bulge and Concentration Camp Liberation

Irving Locker, a name synonymous with courage and resilience, was one of the 156,000 soldiers who stormed the beaches of Normandy on June 6, 1944, landing at Utah Beach. Just six months later, Locker, at the age of 19, had already risen to the rank of Staff Sergeant with the 116th AAA Gun Battalion of the 1st Army's 7th Corps.

In the bitter winter of 1944-1945, Locker found himself in the harsh conditions of the Ardennes Forest, where he would take part in the legendary Battle of the Bulge. Surrounded on three sides, without food, ammunition, or supplies, he faced unimaginable challenges. "When we went into the Battle of the Bulge, they had us surrounded on three sides. We didn't have ammunition, food, or anything. I had to send my own sergeant into our own mortuaries where our own dead people were and take the boots and clothing off of them to bring back," Locker recalled.

But it wasn't just the battlefield that would leave a lasting impact on Locker. He was among the soldiers who helped liberate the Gardelegen Concentration Camp, about 100 miles west of Berlin. The horrors he witnessed there would stay with him for the rest of his life.

As Locker's unit reached Berlin, a symbolic moment occurred. He took a swastika flag from a wall and had some of his comrades sign it. This flag remains one of the many mementos he holds from his time in the war.

After the war, Locker returned home and

built a life with his sweetheart, Bernice. Yet, he couldn't forget the history he had lived through, nor the importance of passing it on. For over eight decades, Locker has shared his story, giving PowerPoint presentations and speaking at events everywhere—from elementary schools to the White House. He has made numerous YouTube videos, always ensuring that the memories of the war and the Holocaust are preserved for future generations. He even returned to Normandy to commemorate the 70th and 75th anniversaries of D-Day.

"Too many people have no idea what we experienced," Locker said. "It's important to me that this story is told after I'm gone, so people don't forget."

Despite his extraordinary experiences, Locker maintains a humble and humorous attitude. Standing at just 5'2", when asked how he survived the war, Locker responded with a smile, "I stood behind a tall guy."




The higher seeded team in each matchup will get to play the first two games at home, while if the series is tied at 1-1, the winner-take-all game would be at the home of the team the had to travel.

UCF baseball claims Big 12 series win from No. 15 TCU

Outstanding pitching carries Knights

ORLANDO — Riding back-to-back outstanding pitching performances, the UCF baseball team (22-17, 6-12 in Big 12) bounced back from an opening game loss to best No. 15 TCU (29-12, 12-6) twice to win the 3-Game Big 12 Conference Series at John Euliano Park.

After the Knights were bested, 6-1, on Thursday, the Black and Gold came to life on Friday, with Russell Sandefer and Dominic Castellano combining on an 8hitter and striking out a season-high 15 batters and Chase Krewson and Dylan King both hit home runs in a 5-1 victory.


