

## Food as Relief



Who knows the faces of those in their community living in poverty and unable to afford food? This story is about shining a light on those often unseen, seeing the faces and environments these people live in, seeing the wrinkles on their hands.

In this photo essay I follow around a food truck owned by a member of Millgrove Baptist Church as they deliver food parcels to those who are not only unable to purchase food for themselves, but are also unable to travel to food programs to access it.

My photo essay connects into the wider story of the current cost of living crisis, the worst on record according to the ABC. The average cost of fruit and vegetables is 8.5 per cent higher than it was at the end of 2021. It is estimated by a joint study between UNSW Sydney and the Australian Council of Social Service that 3.3 million Australians live on or below the poverty line, making risen prices the difference between having one meal a day, or none.

They need to have the food delivered as they do not have a car to get to food programs.

She does not have a car so LinC delivers food to her. The food helps feed herself. This week was what she calls her "bad pension week", the second week after she gets her pension. Getting food relief helps her pay for her risen electricity bills and rent.
