Animated YouTube Video for Kids

Title: Why Do Giraffes Have Long Necks?

Target Age: 4–7

Length: ~1.5 to 2 minutes

Tone: Playful, curious, educational

SCRIPT START

[Opening scene: Bright animated savannah landscape, cheerful music plays]

NARRATOR (friendly, warm voice):

Hey there, curious minds!

[Cut to giraffe standing tall, looking proud]

NARRATOR:

So, giraffe necks aren't just for eating, they're for *competing* too! Pretty cool, huh?

[Cut to baby giraffe looking up at tall tree]

NARRATOR:

From baby giraffes to grown-up giants, their long necks help them stay strong, reach high, and look out for danger across the plains.

[Closing screen with giraffe waving and saying "See you next time!"]

NARRATOR:

Thanks for exploring with us today!
