

“The Hidden Truth About the 3 Heavens in the Bible That shocked the world”.

The narrative of the three heavens has been widely linked to the second book of Corinthians 12:2 where Peter wrote about knowing a man who was taken to the third heaven.

It reads, “I know a certain Christian man who fourteen years ago was snatched up to the highest heaven” - some Bible versions have these last two words written as the “third heaven”.

Similarly, in the book Hebrews, Paul described Jesus Christ as the great High Priest who has passed through the heavens.

Looking at these scriptures logically, there are a few key points to note.

First, to say there is a third heaven simply means that there is also a second and a first.

The one whom Paul was referring to in the book of Corinthians was said to have gone up and beyond the heavens. This means that there is more than one heaven, and the heaven referred to in this book is the highest of them all.

So what really happens in these three heavens, and what purposes are they meant to serve? Let's explore further.

Over the years, there have been several theological writings about the three heavens, and many of these writings have revealed the deep mysteries behind these realms.

The first heaven.

According to biblical experts, the first heaven is made up of the air that we breathe. It is the heaven that is referenced in Bible verses like Deuteronomy 28:12,

“He will send rain in season from his rich storehouse in heaven and bless all your work, so that you will lend to many nations, but you will not have to borrow from any”

Another supporting verse is seen in Acts of the Apostles when Paul said God gives his people rain from heaven, and crops at the right time.

The first heaven is the heaven we see when we look up at the sky - the place where birds fly and clouds form. This is the heaven God was referring to in Genesis 6:7 when he promised to destroy humanity, including beasts, creeping things, and the birds of heaven.

The second heaven comes after this.

It is described as the spiritual realms of the earth. A place that is filled with spiritual beings, including angels and demons.

Biblical scholars have noted that this is probably the most critical realm for humanity since it houses the spiritual powers of this world. The second heaven is where spiritual conflict between the Kingdom of darkness and the Kingdom of God takes place, which is why experts claim it requires the most attention.

A Bible verse that's often used to back this up is Matthew 24 verse 29.

“Immediately after the tribulation of those days, the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light; the stars will fall from heaven, and the powers of the heavens will be shaken.”

Now pay attention to words “sun” and “moon” which have been mentioned in this scripture. This will help you understand some truths that will be uncovered later on in this video.

The next one is the third heaven, often referred to as the heaven of heavens.

Scholars describe this as the dwelling place of God. The heaven that Paul spoke about in second Corinthians. This is the realm where God dwells, far above the physical universe. It is also where the holy angels worship him.

This heaven is referenced in the first book of kings 8 verse 27.

“But will indeed God dwell on the earth? Behold, heaven and the heaven of heavens cannot contain You.”

The third heaven is every believer's home. The final resting place where we are expected to live in fullness with God.

While the mysteries of the three heavens have been discussed for many years, there are those who still consider it a theological misconception.

Which begs the question. How else can these mysteries be proven?

Let's look at things a little more scientifically.

The first heaven has been described as the atmosphere, and this is separated into two layers - the troposphere which contains the air that we breathe, and then the stratosphere.

The second heaven is considered by scholars to be the outer space or the stellar heaven. It is the space behind the atmosphere that is filled with stars, planets, and galaxies. It also contains the two main celestial bodies - the sun and the moon.

The third heaven, on the other hand, is where things might get a little bit tricky. But walk with me.

So far, science has not been able to determine the existence of a spiritual realm, which in this case, is the true heaven where believers hope to spend eternity.

However while there is no direct evidence to the existence of a third heaven, there are scientific theories that indirectly support the idea. One of these is the multiverse theory which suggests that there could be multiple universes or dimensions.

This, in a way, aligns with the idea that there could truly be another universe after space, which, in this context, is the third heaven after the second.

Overall, while there are people who say the three heavens are a misconception, we believe that there is sufficient evidence to back up these claims.

The apostles said it, and even the stories of creation confirm it.
