IN LOCAL NEWS, SENIOR CHEMISTRY MAJOR ABBIE MORGAN TIED FOR FIRST AT THE AMERICAN CHEMICAL SOCIETY'S NATIONAL MEETING IN THE DIVISION OF AGRICULTURE AND FOOD CHEMISTRY'S UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT POSTER COMPETITION IN SAN DIEGO, CALIFORNIA.

MORGAN PRESENTED HER RESEARCH ON KOM-BU-CHA FERMENTATION AND ANALYTICAL CHEMISTRY.

KOM-BU-CHA IS A TEA BEVERAGE THAT HAS GONE THROUGH A FERMENTATION PROCESS. IT CONSISTS OF TEA, WATER, SUGAR, AND THE SCOBY, WHICH IS A SYMBIOTIC CULTURE OF BACTERIA AND YEAST. THE SCOBY INITIATES AND SUSTAINS THE FERMENTATION PROCESS.

HER RESEARCH FOCUSED ON IMPROVING THE ACCURACY AND EFFICIENCY OF ANALYZING HOM-BU-CHA'S MAIN COMPONENTS, SUCH AS SUGAR, ORGANIC ACIDS AND ETHANOL.

HER PROJECT EVALUATED THE USE OF BENCHTOP NUCLEAR MAGNETIC RESONANCE SPECTROSCOPY. ACCORDING TO MORGAN, THIS METHOD CAN REPLACE TRADITIONAL LAB METHODS.

MORGAN ALSO EXAMINED HOW DIFFERENT BREWING METHODS CAN IMPACT THE FERMENTATION PROCESS, SUCH AS USING FRUCTOSE OR GLUCOSE INSTEAD OF SUCROSE AND BREWING IN AN AIR-PERMEABLE BAG VERSUS A GLASS JAR. THROUGH HER AND HER TEAM'S EVALUATIONS, THEY GAINED INSIGHT INTO HOW THE SCOBY'S METABOLISM EVOLVED DURING A TWENTY-EIGHT DAY BREW CYCLE. HER INTEREST IN ANALYTICAL CHEMISTRY WAS THE MAIN REASON WHY SHE CHOSE TO RESEARCH KOM-BU-CHA, AS SHE WANTED TO APPLY ANALYTICAL TECHNIQUES TO A REAL WORLD SYSTEM, SUCH AS KOM-BU-CHA.

MORGAN ACKNOWLEDGED HER MENATORS, DR. JEB KEGERREIS AND DR. JOHN RICHARDSON. SHE ALSO ACKNOWLEDGED HER LAB PARTNER, JADEN PERRIN. SHE THANKED SHIPPENSBURG UNIVERSITY AND THE GRANTS SHE RECEIVED FOR GIVING HER THE FINANCIAL SUPPORT TO CONDUCT THIS RESEARCH.

THIS RESEARCH – ALONG WITH THE UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH OF SHIP STUDENTS SERENA FISHER, KELLY KREBS, SAMANTHA SHA-ZAN-EE-AK, JADEN PERRIN, MADELYN PORTER AND ALIVIA SNYDER – WAS FUNDED BY THE S-U UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH GRANT PROGRAM AND THE JAMES AND MERRY JEAN BERES RESEARCH GRANT.

MORGAN, ALONGSIDE ALL THE SHIPPENSBURG UNIVERSITY UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCHERS THAT COMPETED AT THE AMERICAN CHEMICAL SOCIETY, EXEMPLIFIES HOW RESEARCH CAN PAVE THE WAY TO SUCCESS FOR STUDENTS

A MAN HAS BEEN ARRESTED AFTER COMMITTING A CHAINSAW ATTACK AT CARLISLE CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS.

THE INCIDENT OCCURRED AT TEN FORTY-FIVE P-M ON MONDAY, APRIL FOURTEENTH. THE ATTACKER HAS BEEN IDENTIFIED AS RICHARD SAUDER.

SAUDER WAS FIRED FROM CARLISLE CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS ON THE FOURTEENTH. MANAGERS CLAIM HE WAS FIRED FOR SAFETY CONCERNS.

SAUDER RETURNED THAT EVENING TO AVENGE HIS FIRING. HE ENTERED AN ENCLOSED LOT AND DAMAGED HOSES, A WOODSHED AND TWO RUBBER GASKETS ON CARLISLE CONSTRUCTION'S EQUIPMENT. SAUDER ENTERED PLANT NINE AND SWUNG THE CHAINSAW ABOVE HIS HEAD BEFORE LAYING IT ON CARDBOARD.

AT LEAST SIXTEEN EMPLOYEES WERE DIRECTLY IMPACTED BY THE ATTACK, THOUGH NO ONE WAS HURT. MANY SAID THEY WERE AFRAID SAUDER WOULD INJURE THEM, ACCORDING TO THE AFF-DAY-VIT. SAUDER'S CHARGES INCLUDE BURGLARY, CAUSING OR RISKING CATASTROPHE, TERRORISTIC THREATS, CRIMINAL MISCHIEF, CRIMINAL TRESPASS AND RECKLESSLY ENDANGERING ANOTHER PERSON.

A SOY-UZ M-S TWENTY-SIX SPACECRAFT CARRYING ROS-COSMOS COSMONAUTS ALEXEY OV-CHIN-IN AND IVAN VAN-ER ALONG WITH NASA ASTRONAUT DONALD PET-IT HAS RETURNED TO EARTH ON APRIL NINETEENTH.

THEIR RETURN CONCLUDED A SEVEN-MONTH SCIENCE MISSION ABOARD THE INTERNATIONAL SPACE STATION. PET-IT, OVCHININ, AND VAN-ER LAUNCHED AND DOCKED TO THE ORBITING LABORATORY ON SEPTEMBER ELEVENTH, TWENTY-TWENTY-FOUR.

THE TRIO DEPARTED THE SPACE STATION ABOARD THE SOY-UZ M-S TWENTY-SIX SPACECRAFT BEFORE MAKING A PARACHUTE-ASSISTED LANDING IN THE UL-EE-TAU REGION OF KAZAKHSTAN.

SPANNING TWO HUNDRED AND TWENTY DAYS IN SPACE, PET-IT AND HIS CREWMATES ORBITED THE EARTH THREE THOUSAND, FIVE HUNDRED AND TWENTY TIMES, COMPLETING A JOURNEY OF OVER NINETY MILLION MILES.

DURING HIS TIME ABOARD THE SPACE STATION, PET-IT CONDUCTED RESEARCH TO ENHANCE IN-ORBIT METAL THREE-D PRINTING CAPABILITIES, ADVANCE WATER SANITATION TECHNOLOGIES, EXPLORE PLANT GROWTH UNDER VARYING WATER CONDITIONS, AND INVESTIGATE FIRE BEHAVIOR IN MICROGRAVITY. ALL OF THESE EXPERIMENTS WILL CONTRIBUTE TO FUTURE SPACE MISSIONS. FOR MORE THAN TWO DECADES, PEOPLE HAVE LIVED AND WORKED CONTINUOUSLY ABOARD THE INTERNATIONAL SPACE STATION TO ADVANCE SCIENTIFIC KNOWLEDGE AND MAKE RESEARCH BREAKTHROUGHS THAT ARE NOT POSSIBLE ON EARTH. THE STATION IS A CRITICAL TESTBED FOR NASA TO UNDERSTAND AND OVERCOME THE CHALLENGES OF LONG-DURATION SPACEFLIGHT, ALONG WITH EXPANDING COMMERCIAL OPPORTUNITIES IN LOW EARTH ORBIT.

THIS WAS PET-IT'S AND OV-CHIN-IN'S FOURTH SPACE FLIGHT. PET-IT HAS LOGGED FIVE HUNDRED AND NINETY DAYS IN ORBIT THROUGHOUT HIS CAREER, WHILE OV-CHIN-IN HAS LOGGED FIVE HUNDRED AND NINETY-FIVE DAYS. VAN-ER HAS COMPLETED FOUR HUNDRED AND SIXTEEN DAYS IN SPACE ACROSS HIS TWO SPACEFLIGHTS.

NASA FOLLOWED ITS ROUTINE POST-LANDING MEDICAL CHECKS. THE CREW RETURNED TO THE RECOVERY STAGING AREAS IN KARA-GHANDA, KAZAKHSTAN.

PET-IT THEN BOARDED A NASA PLANE BOUND FOR THE JOHNSON SPACE CENTER IN HOUSTON. ACCORDING TO NASA OFFICIALS AT THE LANDING SITE, PET-IT IS DOING WELL AND IS IN THE RANGE OF WHAT IS EXPECTED FOLLOWING RETURN TO EARTH.

POPE FRANCIS, THE FIRST LATIN AMERICAN LEADER OF THE ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH, DIED ON MONDAY FOLLOWING A STROKE AND CARDIAC ARREST, THE VATICAN SAID, ENDING AN OFTEN-TURBULENT REIGN IN WHICH HE SOUGHT TO OVERHAUL AN ANCIENT AND DIVIDED INSTITUTION. HE WAS EIGHTY-EIGHT AND HAD RECENTLY SUFFERED DOUBLE PNEUMONIA, BUT THE TIMING OF HIS DEATH CAME AS A SHOCK AFTER HE APPEARED IN ST. PETER'S SQUARE IN AN OPEN-AIR POPEMOBILE TO GREET CROWDS GATHERED ON EASTER SUNDAY. POPE FRANCIS' FUNERAL WILL TAKE PLACE ON SATURDAY IN FRONT OF ST. PETER'S BASILICA IN ROME, THE VATICAN ANNOUNCED ON TUESDAY.

VICE PRESIDENT J-D VANCE MET WITH POPE FRANCIS AT THE VATICAN ON EASTER SUNDAY BEFORE THE POPE'S PASSING.

VANCE HAD A BRIEF CONVERSATION WITH THE POPE, ACCORDING TO A STATEMENT FROM THE VATICAN. VANCE ENTERED VATICAN CITY IN HIS MOTORCADE AS EASTER MASS CELEBRATIONS TOOK PLACE IN SAINT PETER'S SQUARE.

VANCE THANKED THE POPE FOR HIS TIME AND EXCHANGED EASTER GREETINGS. HE TOLD THE POPE THAT HE PRAYED FOR HIM EVERY DAY BEFORE DEPARTING.

VANCE'S VISIT TO THE VATICAN ALSO INCLUDED MEETINGS ON SATURDAY, APRIL NINETEENTH, WITH VATICAN SECRETARY OF STATE CARDINAL PEE-EH-TRO PAIR-O-LYNN AND FOREIGN MINISTER ARCHBISHOP PAUL GALLAGHER.

THE TRUMP ADMINISTRATION AND POPE FRANCIS SPARRED ABOUT IMMIGRATION. THE POPE PREVIOUSLY CRITICIZED THE TRUMP ADMINISTRATION FOR ITS PLANS TO DEPORT UNDOCUMENTED IMMIGRANTS. THE VATICAN SAID THERE WAS AN EXCHANGE OF OPINIONS ABOUT THE ISSUE AMONG VANCE, THE CARDINAL AND THE ARCHBISHOP.

AS A PARTING GIFT, THE FORMER POPE GAVE VANCE THREE CHOCOLATE EASTER EGGS, ONE OF EACH OF VANCE'S CHILDREN.
