The weekend of February 8-11, 2018, Lipscomb Academy hosted its 14th annual Art Event in a new location on campus. The McCadams Athletic Center was transformed into a beautiful venue displaying a wide range of media including painting, jewelry and woodworking. This year's featured artist was Vicki Denaburg of Birmingham, Alabama, and was our most successful to date, boasting more than \$205,000 in fine art sales, raising \$89,014 for the Lipscomb Academy Annual Fund.

Our silent auction featured a series of "Music City"themed artwork by Lipscomb Academy students, as well as pieces donated by many of our artists in attendance. All of the proceeds from the silent auction, totaling \$7,150, benefit the fine arts at Lipscomb Academy. Funds from the silent auction have aided in purchasing instruments for the strings program, construction to create a backstage door to Acuff for performers, and purchasing a large format printer and digital cameras for our visual arts programs.





For nearly 40 years, Martha Riedl molded the minds and hearts of students throughout the Lipscomb community. Stepping foot on the campus of Lipscomb Academy in the fall of 1961, Riedl brought commitment, passion and energy to the classroom that is well remembered nearly 20 years after her retirement. As a chemistry teacher, she had the opportunity to show students how faith and science intertwine. As an English teacher, she ingrained in students how the written and spoken word is among the greatest gifts for expressing our deepest sorrows and greatest joys. As teacher of the Christian Woman class, she empowered her students to be bold in their faith and continually seek a deeper relationship with God. Following her retirement in 1998, grateful alumni and friends endowed the Martha Riedl Teacher Excellence Fund to encourage other teachers to grow in their craft and to display the excellence and dedication exemplified by Mrs. Riedl. Grants from the fund are available to any full-time academy faculty member.
