

**Alexander Hamilton U.S. Custom House, New York, NY**



The Alexander Hamilton U.S. Custom House (Cass Gilbert, 1907) is a National Historic Landmark housing offices of several Federal agencies and a branch of the Smithsonian's National Museum of the American Indian. SUPERSTRUCTURES was chosen to conduct a two-phase restoration project on the building. Phase I is the remediation of water infiltration at the basement and sub-basement, including sidewalk vault restoration. This phase includes: leak mitigation for the vehicle ramp, access hatches, and exterior joints; repair or replacement of damaged structures; repair or replacement of MEP components; and removal of hazardous materials. Phase II of the project will include: restoration of the granite facade; restoration of the building's windows for improved efficiency and blast mitigation; repair or replacement of the skylight and laylight; conservation of the rotunda murals; replacement of slate, copper, and built-up roofs; and conservation of 15 sculptures, including four by Daniel Chester French.
