LMU RJ Project

The LMU CURes' Restorative Justice Project has a proven track record of providing

communities with Restorative Practices (RP) tools to develop and repair relationships; to create safe, inclusive schools that are conducive to learning; and to mold knowledgeable, responsible, and civically engaged citizens. However, without proper training and on-going skill-building sessions, teachers are getting the impression they there isn't a viable way to hold students accountable for their behavior and that Restorative Practices simply doesn't work.

In response, CURes provides comprehensive training in restorative principles and practices, and ongoing professional development with school districts. Focusing largely on proactive practices such as community building circles, CURes trains stakeholders to create a safe environment allowing for increased learning. CURes also provides conflict resolution training services to schools that have worked towards building a robust and positive school climate.

With the support the Collins Foundation, an Anonymous Foundation, and service contracts with school partners, the RJP has trained 800+ teachers and school staff and improved the quality of education for 20,000+ Kindergarden-12 students (assuming each trainee will impact at least 25 students given average class sizes). Building upon this foundation, Loyola Marymount University is working to scale-up the RJP across Southern California and position the project for long-term sustainability.


