STAYING GROUNDED The Public Art Program at San Diego International Airport is soaring to new heights thanks to a growing number of thoughtfully integrated museumworthy installations. "The artwork engages passengers and introduces them to cultural and artistic talent from San Diego and beyond," says Lauren Lockhart, program manager. "It's been rewarding to see this create a positive impact on the traveler experience." Alongside 46 permanent public commissions, including Mark Reigelman's Orchid Award-winning Formation (tapestries of colorful resin-cast model planes in the T2 parking structure), 15 temporary exhibitions and numerous live performances can also be enjoyed across the airport.
