What is Delta-8 THC?






is an isomer that naturally occurs in hemp plants in small concentrations.



It is synthetically converted through isomerization with solvents, acid, and heat to produce higher concentrations of delta-8 THC than those found naturally.



The resulting products are a much higher-level psychoactive with side effects very similar to delta-9 THC-the type found in marijuana sold legally in many states. The **problem** is that due to the definition of hemp in the national 2018 Farm Bill, this type of THC is **unregulated**.



Because there are no age restrictions or safety regulations surrounding these products, consumers are getting hurt by ingesting products that are not safe, and kids are accidentally eating products they confuse for other foods.



By clarifying the definition of hemp in the upcoming 2023 Farm Bill, we can put a stop to the unregulated "gray market" of delta-8 THC.

We can make sure Delta-8 THC and other isomers are recognized as psychoactive and not legal hemp.
