# AN ILLUMINATED AFFAIR

Does the quirky name hold significance, or is it just a gimmick? Khevna Pandit visits Lighhouse Café in Worli to find out what's on their menu

here's something about the name that has always intrigued me - so when I heard there was a new outlet in South Bombay. I had no reason not to go check it out. An overwhelming sense of curiosity led me to finally clear my schedule and head on over: and, if like me, you're visiting during late evening, there's no way that you'll miss the massive illuminated board that spells out the name. My dining companion and I made our way into the restaurant, bypassing the gorgeous al fresco seating lined with wooden tables and chairs. We soon found ourselves gawking at the bright interiors and friendly vellow walls - but, what will really catch your eye is the noticeably long bar counter with testtube like glasses arranged on the shelves.

The outlet in Khar is known for its extensive bar menu, and the one in Worli doesn't disappoint either, even though they have been focusing more on the food at this outlet. We were served a round of drinks to start with the LED Sangria (₹165), Austrian Beach (₹350) and Berry Surprise (₹165) for mocktails, and Golden Glory (₹425), Bhagira (₹425) and AK Special (₹275) as cocktails. While the Berry Surprise turned out to be a delightful fruity blend, and an instant favourite, the Austrian Beach didn't come off as expected. My dining companion, on the other hand, enjoyed the tall, refreshing AK Special, which is a creative invention of one of the owners of the restaurant. For our meal, we started off with Tart Bhaaii (₹280), Cheese & Gherkin Balls (₹250) and Veg Enchiladas (₹280) as vegetarian starters, and Jerk Chicken (₹350) and Lamb Kebabs (₹420) as non-vegetarian starters. Every dish was accompanied by a serving of a dip that somehow stood out more than the appetisers themselves. The Veg Enchiladas were almost unrecognisable because of their strange presentation and were slightly off the mark (and very chewy), but the Cheese Gherkin Balls made up for this by having just the right amount of cheesiness that you need to make you feel better! For the non-vegetarian platter, my dining companion was impressed with the Lamb Kebabs more than the lerk Chicken. which turned out to be slightly dry. While the Tart Bhaaii was an innovative concept, with a portion of Pay Bhaaji in a tart, it was rather

Proceeding to the main course, we were recommended the Indie Style Chicago Pizza. made with roasted vegetables, paneer, jalapenos, olives, tomato sauce and Mozzarella Cheese (₹695). A pre-warning to anyone who wants to dive into this deep-dish: the pizza comes with a two-inch thick crust and so, those who cannot finish a thin-crust pizza should lay off! The Indie Style Chicago Pizza could either leave you very happy or very full. But, it's a dream dish for cheese lovers and is loaded with ooey cheese that oozes out of each bite. However, it could be too rich for some. We also tried two of their signature breakfast dishes -Anda Gadbad (₹210), which is an omelette stuffed with boiled egg and kheema, topped with spicy gravy, and a portion of Spinach and Mushroom Crepes (₹325), which were French crepes stuffed with spinach and mushroom, topped with four cheese sauces and thyme. The Anda Gadbad was a delicious omelette. but the crepes were slightly bland.

We ended our culinary journey with the Eggless Chocolate Hazelnut Mousse (₹320), which was a portion of gooey chocolate along with honey glazed melon thyme and hazelnut, which we definitely couldn't get enough of! The smoothness of the rich chocolate blended well with the oatmeal cookie base. All in all, Lighthouse Café took us on an incredible food journey, with a variety of flavours.

Unfortunately, we couldn't try everything that the extensive menu had to offer, but everything from the drinks to the choice of music and of course, the lights, has helped us plan another visit in the future. For those who love the food and drink but aren't particularly fond of the area or ambiance at their Khar outlet, this is worth heading over to for a change of scene, with the same great menu.

# SEEING STARS

No, really – but only when you look up in between your treatment.

Rhea Dhanbhoora takes a beauty break at Myrah Spa and comes away glowing

Respite from the perennial city heat at a spa that's quietly nestled behind a building (with no signs outside — so make sure you've got the right one!) — the perfect weekday evening was right around the corner as I drove up to Myrah Spa's new SOBO setting.

If you're familiar with its Juhu dwellings, you won't be surprised that their South Mumbai entrant has no signs outside to hint at its existence. Of course, since the tiny spa has barely enough room to accommodate walk-ins, this may not be such a bad idea. Once you do walk towards the entrance, the old-school wooden shutters and flower-lined pathway welcome you into a predictably swanky space, complete with the illuminated signboard outside the door that makes up for the lack of one on the street corner.

### **ALL ABOUT THE AURA**

Delicate wisps of lemongrass float through the air inside, as I stepped over the marble-tiled reception and over a pretty red and brown rug into the waiting area, which is a small and slightly cramped space, only big enough for around three to four people at the most. I was drawn to the black and white patterned tiles lining the walls in the space, which has been designed and conceptualised by Nisha Javeri herself (with a little help from famed architect Fabio Correa, of course).

Everything from the wooden bark tables to the (extremely comfortable) burnt orange sun loungers could either impress or intimidate — depending on your mood. It's all very modern, eclectic, very luxurious and very stylish, and while this could seem a bit pretentious to some, it's all tastefully done up.

#### **INNER SECRETS**

A tiny passageway (everything in this new spa is small and compact, in stark contrast with the spacious home it has in Juhu) leads you to five massage rooms and a couple's treatment room, with a moveable partition. The couple's room is as expected of Myrah, with a Jacuzzi, mood lighting — you name it. All the rooms have waterfall showers (try getting out of the comfort of these in under

five minutes, I dare you!) and vaulted ceilings that help you look up at what seems like an inky black carpet of stars during your treatment.

#### **TREAT US RIGHT**

Of course, not much about the treatments at Myrah changes. They still have all my favourites, and the products by Vagheggi remain a constant as well. Like at all spas, you have to fill in a form and pick a treatment before you're led to your room, which at Myrah is small, but cosy, with a safe for your valuables included and a fluffy white robe to cosy up in as you dip your feet into the rose water for a foot wash.

Browsing through a menu of signature Myrah treatments, I settled in for the Silken Body Sheen (₹6,950 for 90 minutes), one of the only treatments (similar at the very least) I have tried without much success at spas across the city through the years. It was fully loaded with a bronze and caviar body sheen and a relaxing treatment (complete with a body rub and a very satisfying massage) that included an exfoliation, which did exactly what it was supposed to. My skin was soft, silky and smooth for at least a week after. You will have to go home with the oil still on your skin though, so keep that in mind before planning your social calendar after your treatment!

The staff here is warmer and friendlier than at their Juhu outlet, and although my masseuse was not particularly talkative, she was perfectly professional, applied just the right pressure and followed my instructions for more neck and shoulder attention.

After the soothing treatment, the most delicious chocolate and after-treatment tea and the excellent service, my only grouse for the evening was having to wait lifteen minutes to get a cab on the busy street — nothing you could fault the spa for, of course.

Myrah is small, and although I like my spas large and airy, it doesn't let the space crunch hamper service or treatment, so you won't even notice the slightly cramped spaces after a bit. Don't skip a visit here to get over a chaotic weekday or indulge on a relaxing weekend — but do make sure you book an appointment as they may not be able to accommodate you as a walk-in.
