CAROLINA BLAZE (8-16) vs. OKLAHOMA CITY SPARK (13-11)

IN THE CIRCLE: Pitcher **Devyn Netz** is expected to make her first start of the season in the circle in tonight's season finale. Netz has authored a 3.71 earned run average in 5.2 innings with two strikeouts.

FULL HOUSE: Carolina has played in front of three consecutive sellout crowds at Smith Family Stadium.

SPARK PLUG: Infielder **Alyssa Brito** is 8-for-13 in four games against Oklahoma City this season after adding a single Sunday. Brito has totaled two home runs, one double, four RBIs and four runs scored during the season series.

CAN'T CAGE CAGLE: Utility player **Valerie Cagle** powered Carolina's offense on Sunday with two home runs and a season-high four RBIs. She became the second Blaze player to hit two home runs in a game this season. Cagle ranks second on the team with a .581 slugging percentage and is batting .333 (4-for-12) over her last three games.

DURHAM DERBY: Home runs have come in bunches during Carolina's final homestand. Teams have combined for 16 home runs over the last four games, including eight by the Blaze from six different players. Duke alumna **Ana Gold** homered in consecutive games at her former home field, while utility player **Valerie Cagle** launched a pair of two-run blasts in Sunday's loss.

CLOSE CALLS: Nine of Carolina's last 12 games have been decided by two runs or less. The Blaze are 2-8 in one-run games this season and have played a league-high six extra-inning contests, including four of their last eight. Carolina is also 1-11 in July, with seven of those losses decided by two runs or fewer.

BLASTWOOD: Catcher **Reese Atwood** is currently fourth in the AUSL with eight home runs. She has hit five homers in July, including two in her last five games. Atwood is two home runs shy of tying the AUSL single-season record of 10, set this season by Oklahoma City's **Maya Brady** and Portland's **Megan Grant**.

THE LONG AND SHORT OF IT: Carolina has played in 12 games that have been decided by either the run rule or extra innings this season, boasting a 4-8 record in those outings. The Blaze went 1-2 in run-rule games and 0-2 in extra-inning contests last season.

KLINGLER'S KLIMB: Infielder **Baylee Klingler** extended her hitting streak to six games with a single in Sunday's defeat. She is batting .364 (8-for-22) during the streak after hitting .242 (8-for-33) over her first 10 games.

EMPTY HITS: Carolina has collected 42 hits over its last four games, including 14 extra-base hits. The Blaze averaged 6.2 hits per game through their first 20 contests. After recording just two double-digit hit performances in their first 21 games, the Blaze have reached double figures in hits in each of their last three outings.

MULTIPLICATION TABLES: Outfielder **Dakota Kennedy** recorded her sixth multi-hit game this season with two singles in Sunday's loss against Oklahoma City. She has a team-high four doubles and ranks first on the club with 20 hits.

IN A PINCH: Carolina leads the AUSL with a .368 batting average (7-for-19) in pinch-hit situations. Utility player **Devyn Netz** is 3-for-3 as a pinch hitter, highlighted by a home run against the Utah Talons on June 27. She has also delivered pinch-hit singles in each of Carolina's last two games.

ADDING WOOD TO THE FIRE: Catcher **Reese Atwood** ranks among the AUSL's top five with 21 RBIs. She is second on the team with 19 hits. Atwood's team-high 21 RBIs account for about 23 percent of Carolina's 91 RBIs this season. She currently owns a team-high 11-game reached base streak.

K-ARLYN: Rookie pitcher **Karlynn Pickens** is second in the league with 60 strikeouts, three shy of tying the AUSL's single-season strikeout record held by Utah's **Montana Fouts**. She ranks fourth in the circuit with a .232 opponent batting average and fifth with a 3.13 ERA.

LEACHING BASES: Infielder **Aubrey Leach** has been a steady presence on the base paths, reaching base in 20 of Carolina's 24 games this season. She leads the Blaze with 16 runs scored and three stolen bases while ranking third with 17 hits. Leach also ranks among the AUSL's top five with 11 walks.

ALL-STAR BLAZE: Ten Carolina players were selected to the AUSL All-Star Cup. Catcher **Reese Atwood**, infielder **Alyssa Brito**, infielder **Ana Gold**, outfielder **Dakota Kennedy**, infielder **Baylee Klingler**, catcher **Kayla Kowalik**, infielder **Aubrey Leach**, outfielder **Aleshia Ocasio**, pitcher **Karlynn Pickens**, and pitcher **Keilani Ricketts**. Kowalik won the 2025 AUSL All-Star Cup, while Ocasio captured the title in 2021. The All-Star Cup runs Aug. 8-30 and features 45 of the AUSL's top players competing for the individual championship.
