NOTES & NUMBERS CONTINUED

- three games decided by one run. UNCW rallied in each of its victories and has played 12 consecutive conference games entering the weekend.
- > UNCW has clinched a return to the CAA Tournament after missing the field last season.
 - > Junior Cassidy Relay leads the Seahawks and the CAA at the plate with a .467 batting average. Relay also leads UNCW with 64 hits. She was named CAA Co-Player of the Week on March 30 and is among the nation's top baserunners with 29 stolen bases.
 - > Junior Allison Corbin, a two-time CAA Player of the Week, leads the team in home runs and ranks second in doubles and tied for second in RBIs.
 - > Freshman Camille Hamilton has emerged as one of the nation's top young pitchers, earning a spot on the 2026 NFCA Division I National Freshman of the Year Top 25 list. She has been named CAA Pitcher of the Week twice and Rookie of the Week twice. Hamilton leads the staff with a 1.67 ERA and 86 strikeouts, allowing just 24 earned runs in 100.2 innings pitched.
 - > UNCW is led by Ashley Wade in her fourth season. Wade guided the Seahawks to the 2024 CAA Tournament title and owns a 113-88 career record.

SERIES HISTORY

- > Campbell holds a 61-31 advantage in the all-time series against UNCW.
- > The Camels swept the Seahawks to open conference play in 2025 in Buies Creek, outscoring UNCW 26-8 across the three games.
- > The teams last met in Wilmington during the 2024 regular season, when Campbell won two of three games. UNCW responded by defeating Campbell in the CAA Tournament Championship later that season.
- > Campbell is 3-0 against the Seahawks under head coach Emily Carosone.

LAST TIME OUT

- > Campbell continued its strong conference play by sweeping Hampton to close its home schedule, run-ruling the Pirates in all three games.

NOTES & NUMBERS CONTINUED

- > On Friday, the Camels earned a 14-3 victory behind a strong offensive performance. Amber DeSena drove in four runs, including a bases-clearing triple, while Allyiah Swiney went 3-for-3 with three RBIs. Emma Slutzah reached base four times and scored three runs.
- > On Saturday, Campbell celebrated Senior Day with a doubleheader sweep. Haley Krebs went 5-for-5 with two RBIs and three runs scored across the two games. Kylie Specht drove in four runs on 3-for-6 hitting, while Slutzah added four RBIs and three runs scored. DeSena finished 4-for-4 with four RBIs and three runs scored, and Charlie Montgomery added five hits as Campbell totaled 22 hits and 18 runs on the day. In the circle, Katelyn Hubley limited Hampton to four hits and struck out seven in a five-inning shutout.
- > Montgomery was named CAA Player of the Week, while Hubley earned CAA Pitcher of the Week honors.

DIAMOND DETAILS

- > The Camels have defeated three Big Ten opponents in the 2026

season. They defeated Illinois at the War Eagle Classic, Iowa at the Campbell Invitational, and Ohio State at the Ohio State Tournament.

- > The tandem of Katelyn Hubley and Kasey Wolfe is a combined 16-1 in league play.

PUTTING THE LEAGUE ON NOTICE

- > Campbell has surged in CAA play, sweeping four of seven series and outscoring opponents 179-46, an average margin of 6.33 runs per game and 8.52 runs scored per game.
- > Charlie Montgomery earned CAA Co-Player of the Week honors on Feb. 10 after hitting .643/.688/.857 over five games at the Campbell Stampede.
- > Allyiah Swiney followed with CAA Player of the Week honors on Feb. 17, posting a .571/.625/.929 slash line at the War Eagle Classic.
- > Katelyn Hubley was named CAA Co-Rookie of the Week on March 3 for her performance at the Battle at the Max tournament. Hubley made two starts, earning two wins with nine strikeouts and only two earned runs allowed over 12 innings for a 1.17 ERA.
- > Hubley earned her second CAA Rookie of the Week nod on March 30. Hubley delivered one of her top performances of the season in Campbell's extra-inning 3-1 victory over Elon on Friday. The Henrico, Va., native tossed all 10 innings and threw 124 pitches in the complete-game victory. The freshman surrendered just one hit and one earned run while striking out eight batters in total, including three in extra innings, to pick up her 10th win of the season.
- > Hubley earned her third weekly award and first Pitcher of the Week nod on April 6, going 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA to lead Campbell to a sweep of CAA foe N.C. A&T. The freshman threw two complete games, recording back-to-back 2-0 shutouts in less than 24 hours. Over 14 innings, she allowed just five hits, with none going for extra bases, and struck out 17 batters.
- > On April 13, Hubley was named CAA Pitcher of the Week in back-to-back weeks and Montgomery was named CAA Player of the Week. Hubley continued her standout freshman campaign with a 2-0 record to lead Campbell to a series victory over Hofstra. The Henrico, Va., native threw two complete games over 12.0 innings, posting a 0.00 ERA with 16 strikeouts. Montgomery continued her strong senior season, helping Campbell secure a series win over Hofstra. The senior center fielder slashed .500/.538/.583 across four games.
- > On April 27, Hubley was named CAA Pitcher of the Week and Montgomery was named CAA Player of the Week. Hubley continued to excel in the circle, going 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA in the series against Hampton. She allowed just five hits and one walk over 8.2 scoreless innings. In four games, Montgomery slashed .727/.692/.909 overall with an 8-for-11 showing at the dish. Montgomery drove in two RBIs and scored four times, while collecting two hits and at least one run in all three conference matchups.
- > Hubley is the first Camel to earn five weekly honors this season and

now holds the program record for single-season CAA weekly awards. She is also the second player in program history to earn multiple CAA Rookie of the Week honors, joining sophomore Hannah Cornetto.

- > Montgomery is the first player in program history to earn multiple CAA Player of the Week nods.

HUBLEY HEATING UP

- > Freshman Katelyn Hubley has emerged as the Camels' top arm, leading the team with 136.1 innings pitched. She also paces the staff with 127 strikeouts, which is more than the rest of the pitching staff combined (85). She owns a team-best 2.21 ERA. Since March 20 and over her last ten starts, her ERA has improved from 3.91 to 2.21.
- > Hubley has thrown 15 complete games in 21 starts and owns a 17-3 record. Hubley has also pitched five shutouts, all coming in conference action.
- > From the third inning of Campbell's March 27 10-inning game at Elon through the sixth inning of its April 19 home matchup against Elon, Hubley went 46 consecutive innings without allowing an earned run.

A "WOLFE" IN CAMELS' CLOTHING

- > Kasey Wolfe owns a 3.47 ERA over 88.2 innings while holding opponents to a .272 batting average.
- > She tossed a complete-game shutout against Hampton, allowing three hits over five innings.
- > At the War Eagle Classic, she earned a complete-game shutout against Illinois, allowing two hits and striking out three.

THE ROOKIE OF THE YEAR RETURNS

- > Hannah Cornetto has continued to be an impact player for the Camels on both offense and defense. She has five home runs, 289RBIs and a team-high 331 putouts this season.
- > Cornetto was named to the Preseason All-CAA Team after earning CAA Rookie of the Year honors in 2025. She also received First Team All-CAA and All-Rookie Team recognition and earned three CAA Rookie of the Week awards.
- > Cornetto batted .323 to rank fourth on the team. She finished third in hits (53), tied for second in doubles (nine) and led the team with six home runs. She also drew a team-high 38 walks, the third most in a single season in program history.
- > Defensively, Cornetto posted a .986 fielding percentage with a team-high 349 putouts and 14 assists. She contributed to a team-high 24 double plays, tied for the second most in a single season in program history.

THE DeSENA DIFFERENCE

- > As the team's most experienced player, Amber DeSena has been a leader on and off the field. DeSena is hitting .361 and ranks top three on the team in runs, hits and doubles while leading the team with 16 stolen bases.

- > DeSena earned her first All-CAA honor with a selection to the Preseason All-CAA Team
- > In 2025, DeSena tied for the team lead with 10 doubles and finished with 36 RBIs, tied for second on the team.
- > Defensively, she tallied 47 putouts and a team-high 97 assists for a .973 fielding percentage.

MONTGOMERY MAGIC

- > Charlie Montgomery is having a standout senior season, leading the team in both batting average and hits.
- > She earned CAA Player of the Week on April 13 after hitting .500/.538/.583 over four games against Hofstra.
- > She also earned CAA Co-Player of the Week on Feb. 10 after going 9-for-14 with six RBIs and three stolen bases at the Campbell Stampede.
- > She recorded a 23-game hitting streak, the longest by a Camel in at least the past decade, before it ended March 28.
- > Montgomery entered the 2026 season as one of the longest-tenured Camels on the roster with 161 career games played.
- > She was named to the Preseason All-CAA Team after posting career highs in nearly every statistical category in 2025. Montgomery led the team with 194 at-bats and ranked second with 65 hits. Montgomery scored 41 runs and added 17 stolen bases, both ranking second on the roster.
- > Defensively, she posted a perfect 1.000 fielding percentage. She finished the season with 43 career stolen bases, ninth in program history.

SWINEY SEASON

- > Allyiah Swiney has continued to be a force at the plate for Campbell. She leads the team in runs, home runs, slugging percentage and on-base percentage. She ranks top three on the team in hits and is tied for first in doubles.
- > Swiney has continued to climb the program record book during her senior season. She is currently third in runs scored, fourth in RBIs, sixth in doubles, fourth in walks, and tied for eighth in total bases.
- > She earned CAA Player of the Week on Feb. 17 after going 8-for-14 with six RBIs at the War Eagle Classic. She went 6-for-9 with six RBIs in a doubleheader that included a two-run home run against Illinois and a bases-clearing double against Binghamton.
- > Swiney entered the 2026 season as the longest-tenured Camel on the roster with 173 career games played.
- > She was named to the Preseason All-CAA Team after earning Second Team All-CAA honors in 2025.
- > Last season, Swiney tied for the team lead with 10 doubles and four triples and tied for second with three home runs. She posted career highs with a .312 batting average, .471 slugging percentage and .392 on-base percentage, including a .373/.465/.566 slash line in conference play.

NOTES & NUMBERS CONTINUED

- > Defensively, Swiney recorded a .990 fielding percentage with 91 putouts and four assists. She enters the 2026 season tied for 10th in program history with a .983 career fielding percentage.

BUILT "FORD" TOUGH

- > Madison Ford has been the Camels' anchor behind the plate at catcher. She has thrown out 10 runners attempting to steal, ranking among the top in the NCAA.
- > Ford earned a Preseason All-CAA honorable mention for the second time in her career.
- > In 2025, she scored 32 runs and drew 32 walks while posting a .306 batting average, .395 slugging percentage and .441 on-base percentage.
- > Defensively behind the plate, Ford tallied a 184 putouts, second on the team, and 25 assists for a .995 fielding percentage.

SLUTZAH SURGE

- > Slutzah has been one of Campbell's most dependable players, posting a 1.000 fielding percentage in left field.
- > She is hitting .411 with 39 hits, five doubles and 30 RBIs in just 95 at-bats this season.
- > Slutzah has improved dramatically on her numbers from her freshmen season where she posted a .209 batting average, .254 slugging percentage and .300 on-base percentage.

THE SPECHT-ACULAR FRESHMAN

- > Kylie Specht has been a versatile and standout player for the Camels in her rookie campaign. She is hitting .333 with 41 hits, including six doubles, three triples and a home run. She ranks among the team leaders with 39 RBIs and has added 31 runs scored. Specht has made appearances at designated player, second base, shortstop, third base, and left field.
- > Specht comes to the Camels after a standout high school career at Charles E. Jordan in Durham. She recorded the highest batting average in North Carolina in 2025, hitting .683.

HALEY HEROICS

- > Haley Krebs is hitting .383 with 41 hits and 35 runs scored in 43 games this season. She has added 15 RBIs and a .509 on-base percentage while going a perfect 15-for-15 on stolen bases.
- > Krebs has also been a steady presence defensively at second base and shortstop with 72 putouts and 80 assists in the field.
- > Krebs has avoided a sophomore slump in her second season, improving on a freshman campaign in which she hit .196 with a .196 slugging percentage and a .271 on-base percentage.

YEAR TWO JUMP

- > The Camels have improved across multiple categories in Year 2 under head coach Emily Carsone.

- > Runs per game have increased from 5.88 to 6.86, a 16.7% jump year over year. Hits tell a similar story, rising from 7.74 per game to 8.74, a 13.0% increase.

- > Campbell welcomes nine newcomers for the 2026 season. The group includes six

- > Campbell had a league-high four players named to the Preseason All-CAA team: Hannah Cornetto, Amber DeSena, Charlie Montgomery and Allyiah Swiney.
- > The Camels also added two honorable mentions, Alyssa Armijo and Madison Ford, tying for the league high.

- > Campbell returns a large portion of its offensive production from a season ago, led by 82.9% of its at-bats and 82.8% of its RBIs. The Camels also bring back 80.3% of their runs scored, 79.8% of their hits and 76.5% of their home run production.
- > Last season, Campbell ranked third in the conference in batting average and second in runs, hits and RBIs, while leading the league in on-base percentage.

NEW FACES IN THE CIRCLE

- > Campbell returns just 28.9% of its innings pitched from the 2025 season.
- > The leading returner is Emily Dameron, who appeared in 17 games with 13 starts and logged 59.1 innings.
- > The Camels also bring back Cassiti Baroni, who pitched in 26 games, the second-most on the team, with three starts and 47.1 innings of work. Baroni posted the second-best ERA on the roster at 2.96.
- > Campbell added five new pitchers in the offseason to join Dameron and Baroni in the bullpen.

MAKING NOISE IN THE CAA

- > Campbell enters its third season in the Coastal Athletic Association in 2026.
- > The Camels opened CAA play with a three-game series sweep of Hampton. Campbell scored 40 runs across the series, the most in a CAA series in program history.
- > The Camels have reached the CAA Championship in each of their first two seasons, falling to UNCW in 2024 and Elon in 2025.
- > Campbell captured the CAA regular-season title in its first year in the league in 2024, finishing 22-5 in conference play.
- > The Camels are 41-13 in CAA games over their first two seasons, a .759 winning percentage. That mark ranks second in the league over the past two seasons, trailing only former CAA member Delaware (.815).
- > Since joining the conference, Campbell has produced two CAA Rookies of the Year, one Player of the Year, one Pitcher of the Year and one Coach of the Year. The Camels have also earned four All-Rookie Team selections, one Second Team All-CAA honoree and eight First Team All-CAA selections.

CALIFORNIA DREAMIN'

- > Campbell features seven players from California, the most from any state on the roster.
- > Across the rest of the CAA, there are nine players from California, and no other team has more than two.

ASSISTANT COACH ABBY TAYLOR

- > Abby Taylor joined the Campbell coaching staff as an assistant coach in September 2024.
- > She previously served as a student manager and later a graduate assistant for three years under head coach Courtney Carosone at Auburn. During her time with the Tigers, Auburn advanced to three NCAA Regionals and reached the regional final in both 2023 and 2024.
- > In 2024, Auburn posted a 29-21-1 overall record and a 9-15 mark in SEC play while competing against the nation's 11th-toughest schedule.
- > A native of West Point, Georgia, Taylor played golf for two seasons

at Point University before transferring to Auburn, where she earned a bachelor's degree in physical education teacher education in 2023.

ASSISTANT COACH HUNTER SEGARS

- > Hunter Segars was named an assistant coach for Campbell softball in September 2024.
- > Like Taylor, Segars previously served as a student manager and later a graduate assistant for three years under head coach Carosone at Auburn. He also worked with Carosone in Chicago with Athletes Unlimited.
- > A self-taught pitcher, Segars regularly throws live to hitters in practice.

ASSISTANT COACH HANNAH SPARKS

- > The newest addition to the staff, Hannah Sparks was named an assistant coach for Campbell softball in June 2025.
- > She spent the 2024 season as an assistant coach at Nicholls State, where she helped the Colonels post a .321 team batting average, a 53-point improvement and a new program record. Sparks also contributed to improvements of nearly 60 points in on-base percentage and 28 points in slugging percentage. Under her guidance, infielder Claire Sisco earned first-team all-conference honors after leading the Southland Conference in batting average during the regular season.
- > Prior to her time at Nicholls State, Sparks served as an assistant coach at Auburn, helping guide the Tigers to a 29-21-1 record against the nation's 11th-toughest schedule. Auburn recorded nine Quad 1 wins and made its 10th consecutive NCAA Regional appearance.
- > In 2023, Sparks was the volunteer assistant coach at her alma mater, Oklahoma, when the Sooners finished 61-1 and captured Big 12 regular-season and tournament titles. That coaching staff was named NFCA Division I Staff of the Year. Oklahoma led the nation in earned run average (0.96), batting average (.367) and fielding percentage (.988), while setting NCAA and program records with a 53-game winning streak, 35 shutouts, 29 run-rule wins and a 28-0 record against ranked opponents. During that season, five Sooners were named NFCA First Team All-Americans and eight student-athletes earned All-Big 12 honors.
- > A 2018 graduate of Oklahoma, Sparks was a national champion catcher with the Sooners in 2017. She made more than 70 career appearances at Oklahoma after transferring from Northwest Florida State College, where she was an NFCAA Division I All-American and helped lead the program to the 2016 Panhandle Conference championship. She is a native of Thomasville, Alabama.
- > Before returning to Oklahoma, Sparks spent three seasons at Pearl River Community College as the hitting and catching coach and recruiting coordinator. In 2021, Pearl River hit .335 as a team

and totaled 43 home runs.

- > Sparks began her coaching career as a graduate assistant at Lee University.

CAA TOURNAMENT

- > The 2026 CAA Softball Championship will be held May 6-9 and hosted by reigning champion Elon.
- > With the newly introduced North and South divisions, the six-team bracket will include the top two teams from each division based on conference record. The final two spots will be awarded to the next-best teams by conference record, regardless of division.
- > The tournament winner will receive the conference's automatic bid to the NCAA Division I Softball Championship.

Named Campbell's head coach in August 2024, Carosone is in her second season as the Camels' head coach and her second season as a head coach. With a Friday afternoon win over Hampton earlier this season, Carosone became the fastest coach in program history to reach 50 career wins, accomplishing the feat in 78 games, one fewer than her predecessor, Trena Prater.

Carosone was among the nation's best newcomers in 2025, finishing the year tied in second for the most wins (37) among first-time Division I head coaches. She matched Jacksonville State's Julie Boland (37), both sitting right behind Nevada's Victoria Hayward (41).

She spent four seasons at Auburn, serving as associate head coach in 2024. That season, the Tigers played the nation's 11th-toughest schedule and earned nine of their 29 wins against Quad 1 opponents, the program's most since 2018, including series victories over Alabama and LSU. The LSU series marked Auburn's first series win in Baton Rouge in nearly a decade. Carosone originally joined Mickey Dean's staff at Auburn as a graduate assistant in the fall of 2017 and was promoted to volunteer assistant coach the following spring before leaving to train for the 2020 Tokyo Olympics as a member of the Italian National Team. A dual citizen of Italy and the United States, she started all five games for Team Italy at the Tokyo Olympics.

As a player at Auburn, Carosone helped lead the Tigers to two SEC Tournament titles and back-to-back NCAA Women's College World Series appearances. She stands as the Auburn's all-time leader in batting average (.406), hits (285), runs scored (267), on-base percentage (.534) and hit by pitch (85). She earned NFCA All-America honors three times, including first-team recognition as a junior, and was a finalist for USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year in 2015. She also claimed All-SEC honors as a sophomore and junior.

Carosone played four professional seasons after being selected No. 22 overall by the Chicago Bandits in the 2016 National Pro Fastpitch Draft. During her rookie season, she helped the Bandits win the Cowles Cup. She finished her professional career with a .273 batting average and shared the home run title during the 2018 NPF season after hitting 12 homers. She earned her bachelor's degree from Auburn in psychology with a minor in business.

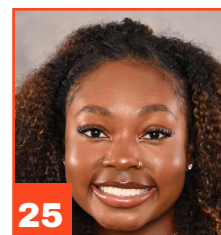

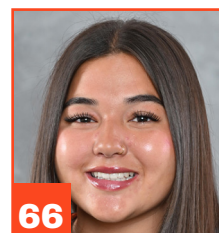

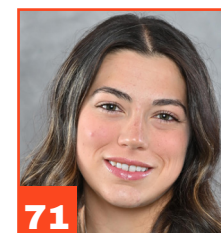
