With a student-to-faculty ratio of 12:1, students form strong connections with their professors and peers. Strong professor relationships allow students to take advantage of great career support and graduate school recommendations.

The majority of our students come from outside of the state of Tennessee!

Slide 8 - Academic Opportunities

At Belmont University, we offer over 130 programs of study, with new majors continually emerging to align with industry needs—especially here in Nashville. Signature programs like Music Business, Hospitality and Tourism Management, and Architecture prepare students for thriving careers in dynamic fields.

From their very first semester, students dive into courses within their major, gaining hands-on experience early on. Nearly half of our students participate in internships or field experiences before they graduate, ensuring they are career-ready. Our BELL Core curriculum provides a well-rounded education across all years of study, ensuring students gain both depth in their chosen field and breadth across disciplines.

Slide 9 – Introducing Dolly U

This experiential approach extends to unique partnerships like Dolly U, a first-of-its-kind collaboration providing immersive learning opportunities tied to Dolly: An Original Musical, premiering at Belmont's Fisher Center for the Performing Arts in Summer 2025 before heading to Broadway in 2026.

This semester alone, 100 Belmont students are enrolled in specialized courses connected to Dolly U, developing marketing strategies and pitching directly to Dolly Parton's team. Additionally, up to six Student Fellows will continue their hands-on learning in 2025, collaborating with CTK Enterprises as the musical moves through production.

Belmont had the honor of hosting Dolly Parton on campus for the official Dolly: An Original Musical announcement. Below, you can see moments from her visit, where she met with students and shared her excitement for this project.

Slide 11 – WELL Core

We want our students to be well-rounded here at Belmont, so we also have an extra-curricular graduation requirement called the WELL Core. Students must get 5 credits in 10 categories that emphasize well-being. Some examples include attending a job fair, doing a service project, listening to a speaker on campus, or attending a financial wellness event.

Slide 12 - Required Religion Courses

Belmont is a Christ-centered university, welcoming students from all faith backgrounds, different Christian denominations, or no faith background at all. All our faculty and staff at the undergraduate level are professing Christians from all different denominations. Our Christ-centered identity offers students the opportunity to discover their greater purpose in their community and the world.

As part of our academic curriculum, you'll be required to take two religion courses during your first and third years at Belmont. You can choose between Path A or Path B to meet the religious requirements. Examples of the topical courses in Path B include Questions that Matter, Jesus in the Gospel and in Film, and World Religions.

We care about students as whole people, not just as students in a classroom. We have over 200 clubs and organizations for you to explore and get involved with on campus.

We have over 200 student organizations here at Belmont! We host an organization fair at the beginning of every year where students can learn about all of our involvement opportunities. Not only are Belmont students very involved on campus, but we also give many opportunities for students to grow their leadership skills within these organizations.

Belmont is a Division 1 school in the Missouri Valley Conference with 17 athletic teams. Our studentathletes excel both academically and athletically and are a vibrant part of our campus community. All Belmont students, staff, and faculty can attend sports events for free!

97% of our graduates are employed, enrolled in graduate school, or serving in the military within six months of graduation.

We are ranked 15th nationally for study abroad! About 35.5% of our students study abroad, gaining valuable global learning experiences.

Students benefit from individualized academic advising, the GPS (Growth and Purpose for Students) Office, and the Office of Career and Professional Development.

Slide 24 - Application Types

Our application opens on August 1! We offer three types of applications, and we have no preference for which one you choose.

Your application will include an essay, a resume, and an option to apply for the Honors Program. You will also have the option to submit a supplemental essay. You are welcome to use this essay to highlight anything additional the Admissions Committee may need to know about, such as a change in high school that may have affected your grades, any impacts of COVID-19 and a shift to online learning, or any personal circumstances that may have affected your high school years.

Slide 25 - Admissions Requirements

Your high school transcript must come directly from your school.

The average GPA for this year's incoming freshman class is 3.7 (weighted). This is not a minimum GPA but an average.

A counselor recommendation is required. Homeschool students need a personal letter of recommendation from a non-family member or peer.

Test scores are optional. We super score and recommend submitting them as they can only benefit you. Students can be test-optional and still be eligible for scholarships and financial aid.

Slide 26 – Admissions Timeline

At Belmont, we offer three ways to apply, so you can choose what works best for you! Apply Early Action I or Early Action II to get your admission decision early and be considered for our top scholarships. If you need more time, Regular Decision applications are open until March 1, with decisions released within 1-2 weeks. No matter when you apply, you'll have until May 1 to submit your enrollment deposit! This will kick off the next steps like housing and orientation.

Slide 27 - Scholarships

Your application for admission is also your application for merit scholarships.

Merit scholarships range from \$3,000 to \$22,000 per year and are renewable for up to four years with a cumulative GPA of 3.0.

Slide 28 - FAFSA

We encourage all families to file the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). This application helps determine your family's financial aid eligibility, including federal grants, Belmont grants, federal work-study, and loans.

The FAFSA will be available in December 2024, with a priority filing date of March 1. Filing sooner rather than later is beneficial.

For Tennessee residents, filing the FAFSA is the paper trail for the Tennessee HOPE Scholarship.

Financial aid packages will be sent electronically starting in January.
